other people about God's love.

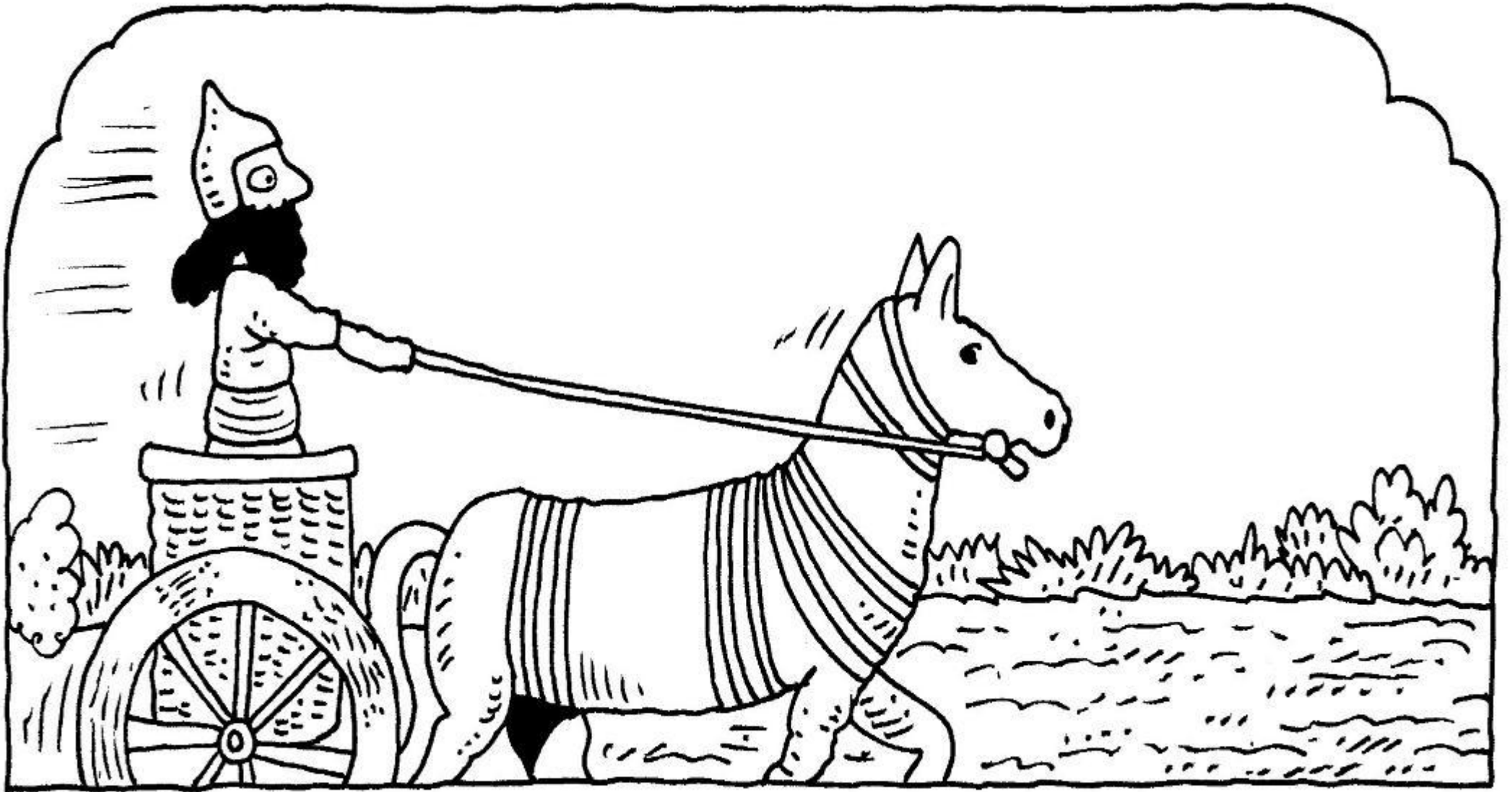




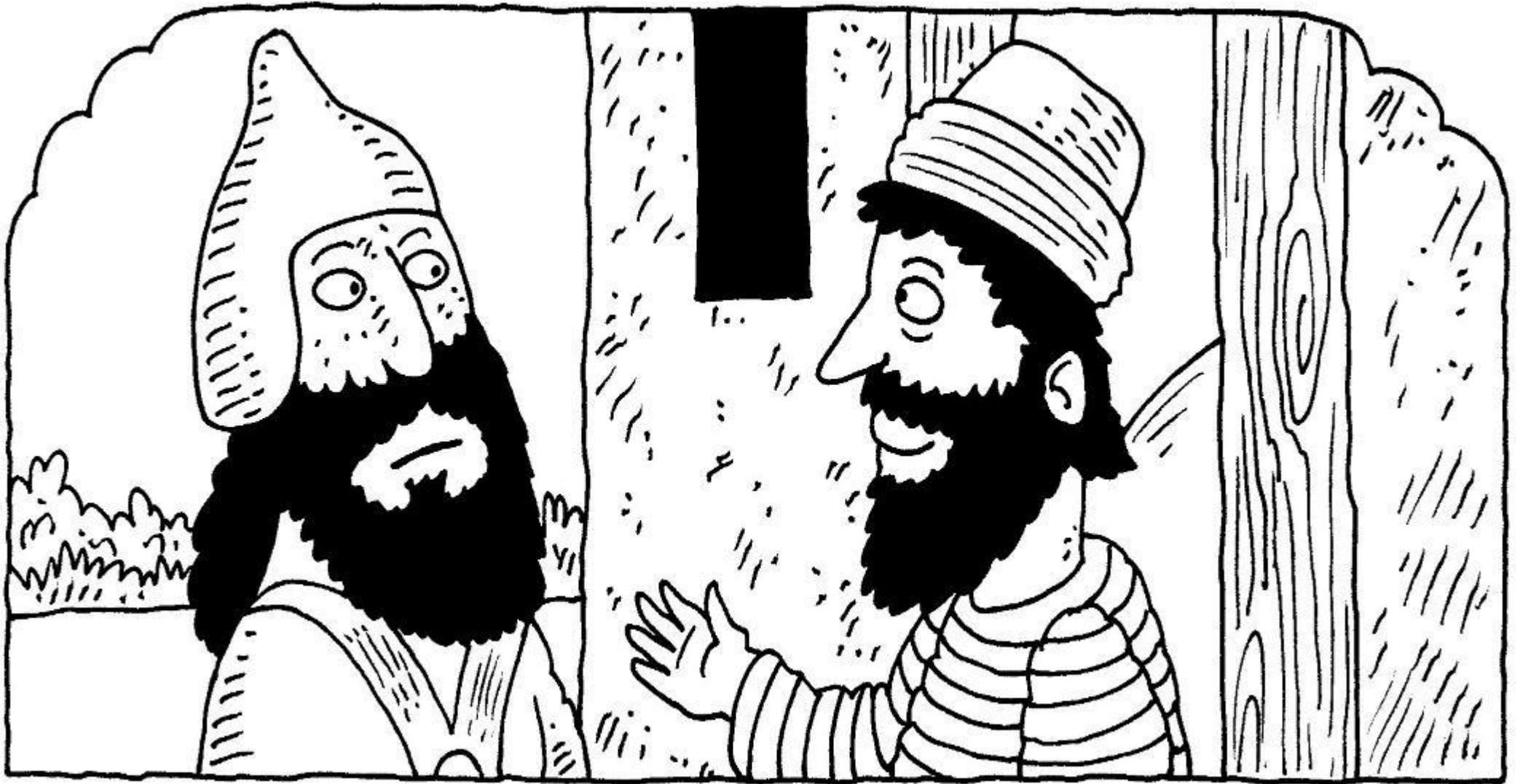
Naaman was in charge of the army of Syria

which not even the best doctor could fix.



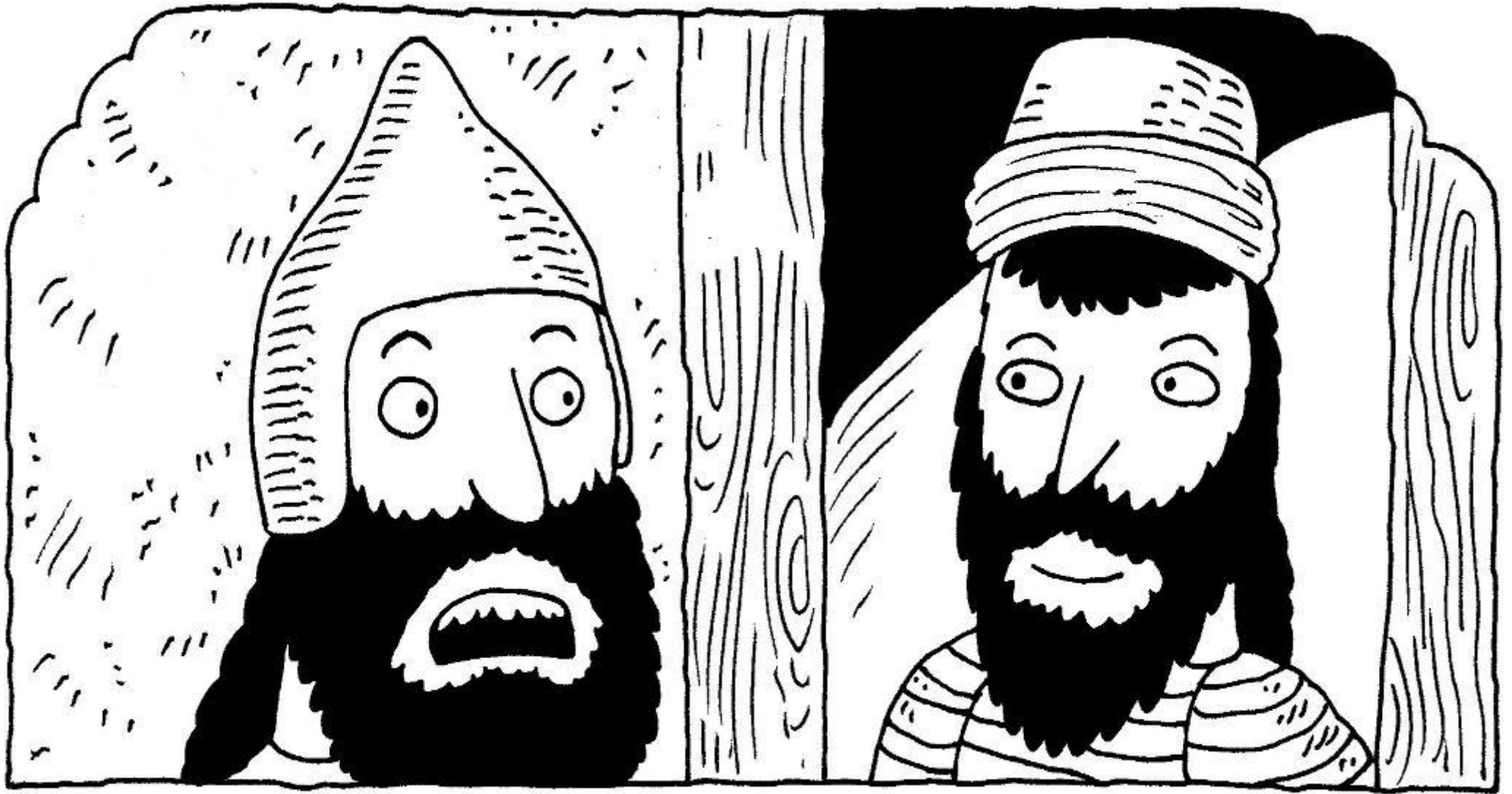
Naaman's little servant girl said to her mistress,

even though Naaman didn't know God for himself.



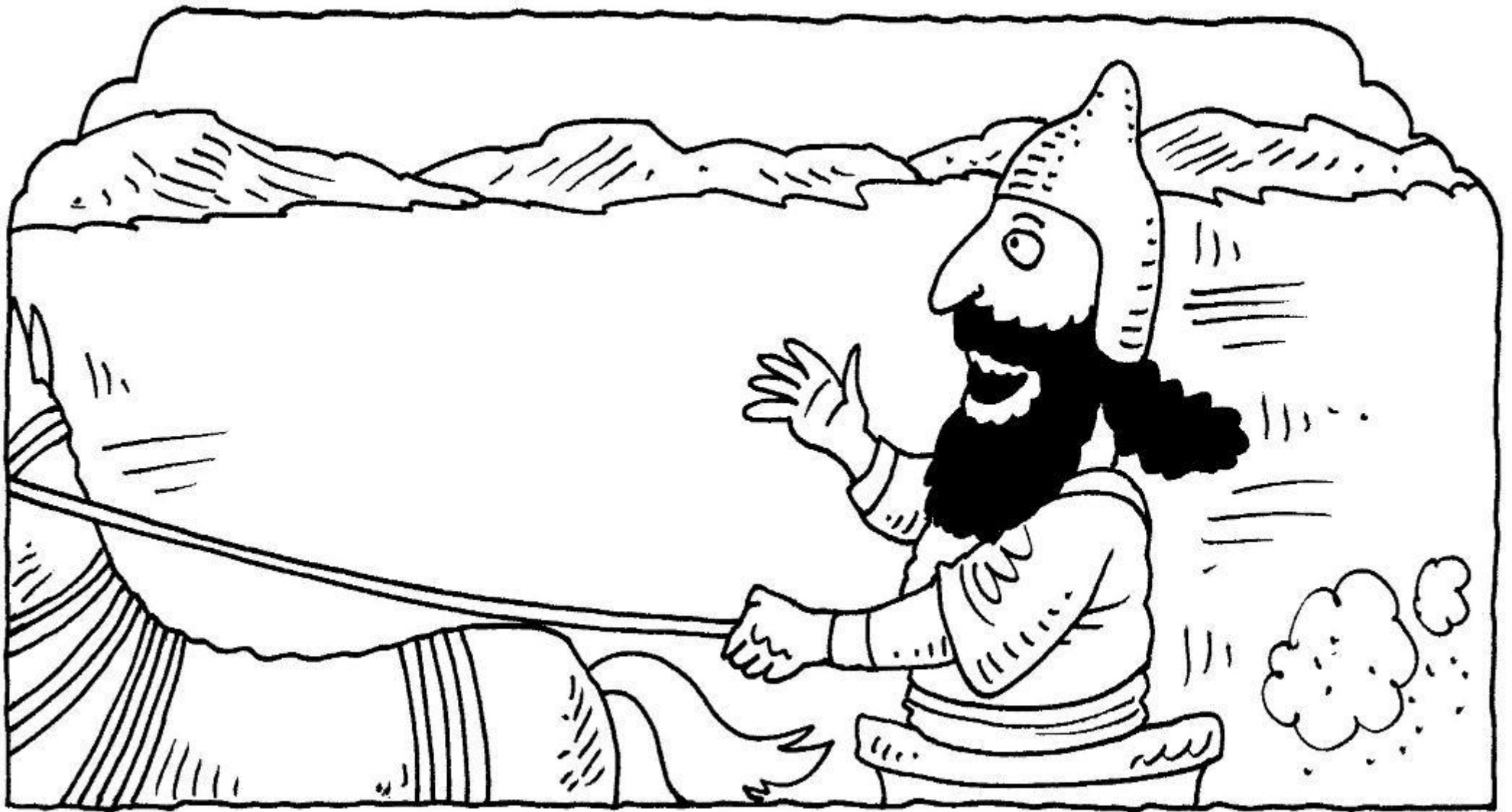
When he knocked on Elisha's door
