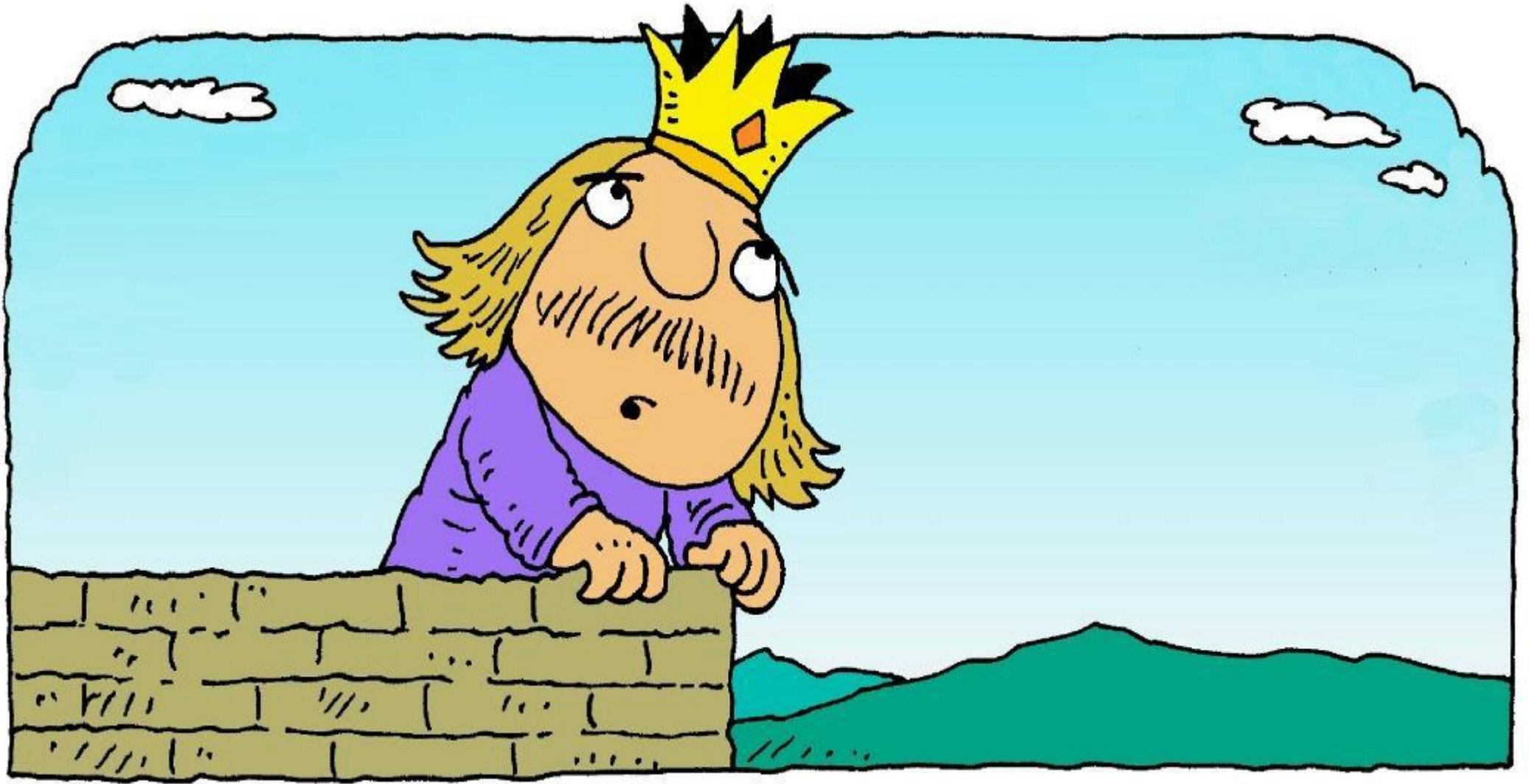

and I don’t need God at all,” he thought.

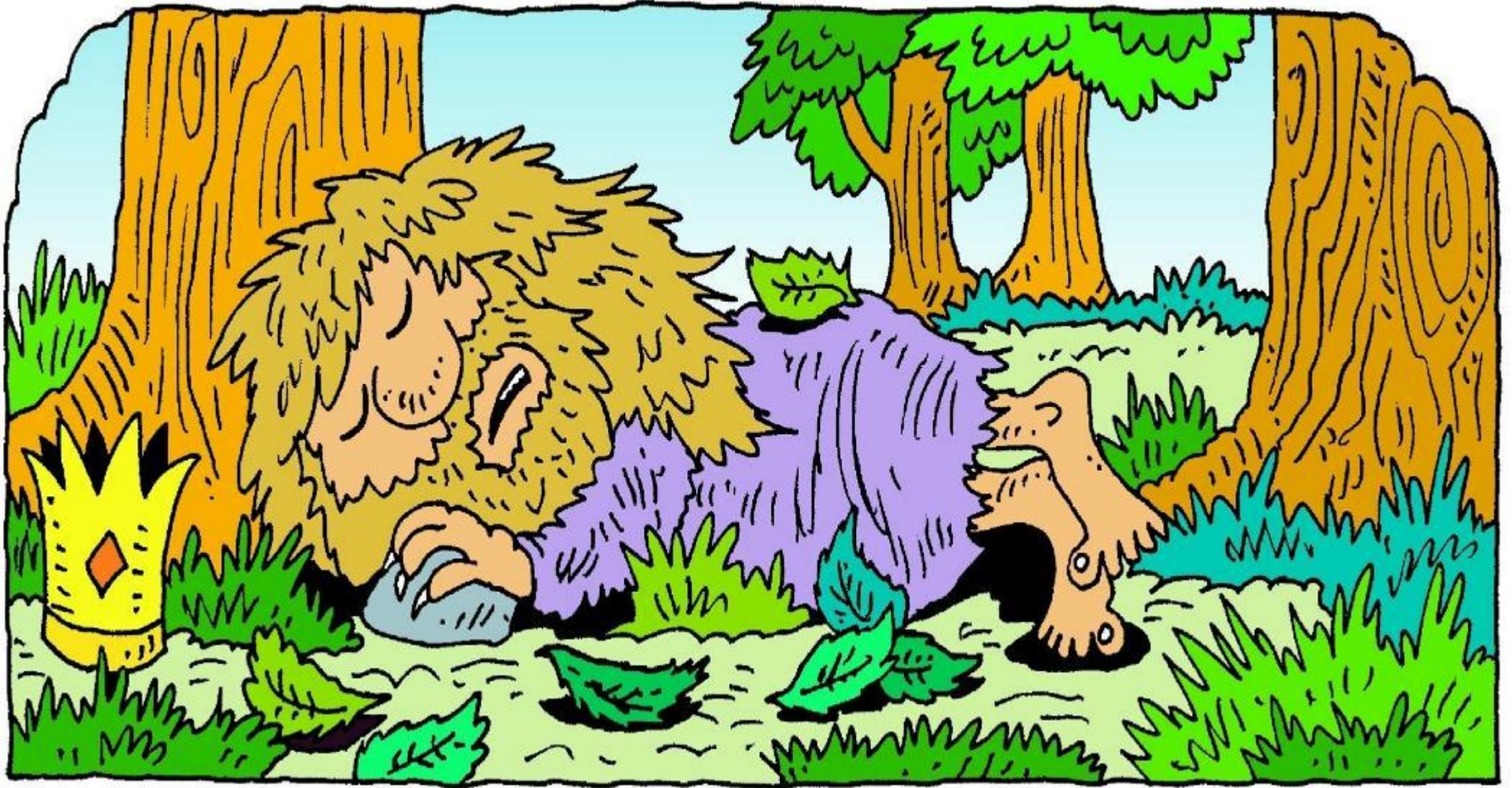


God was not pleased with this king

living like an animal!” said God.



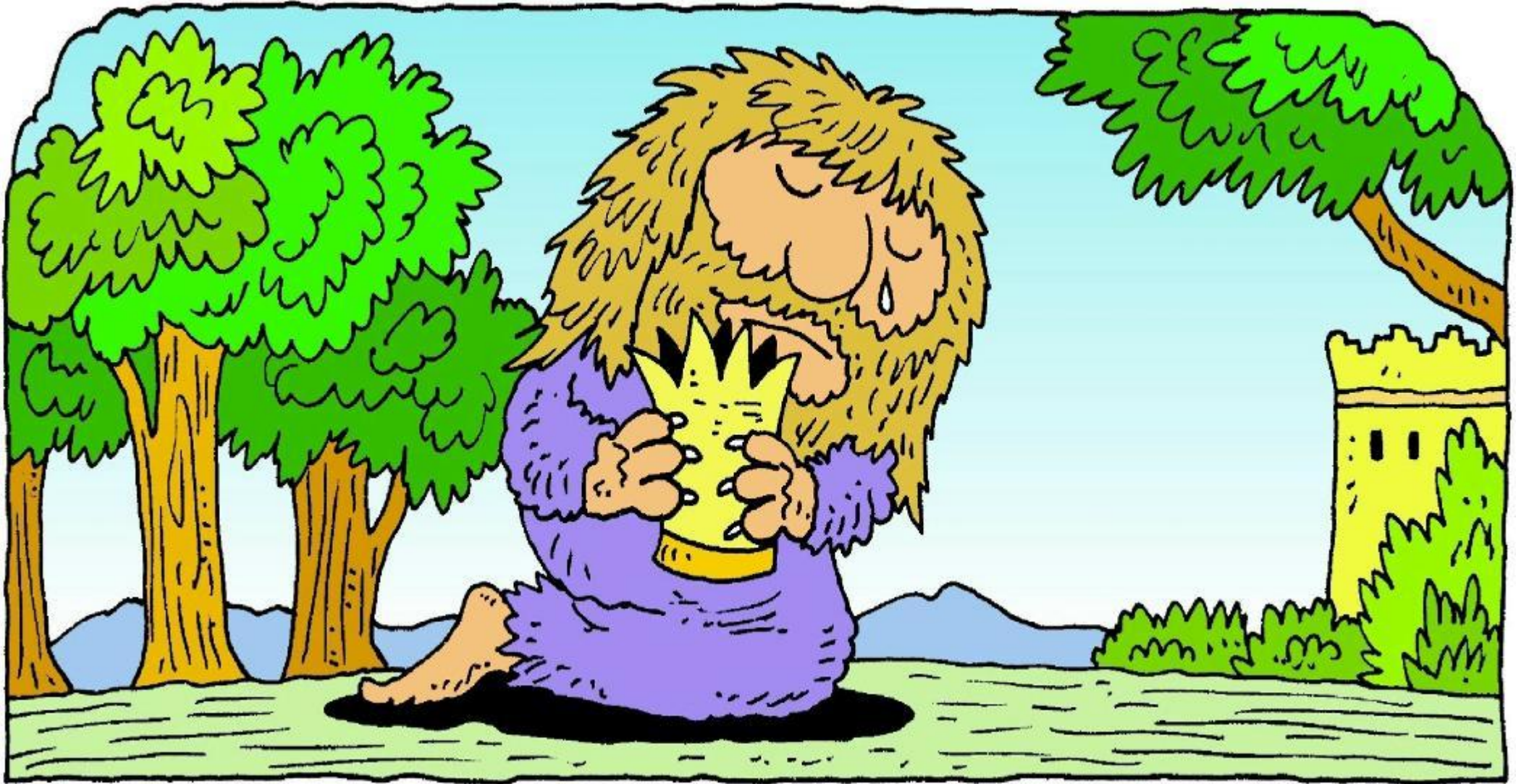
The proud king started to change how he behaved. He went outside his palace and lived like an animal.
