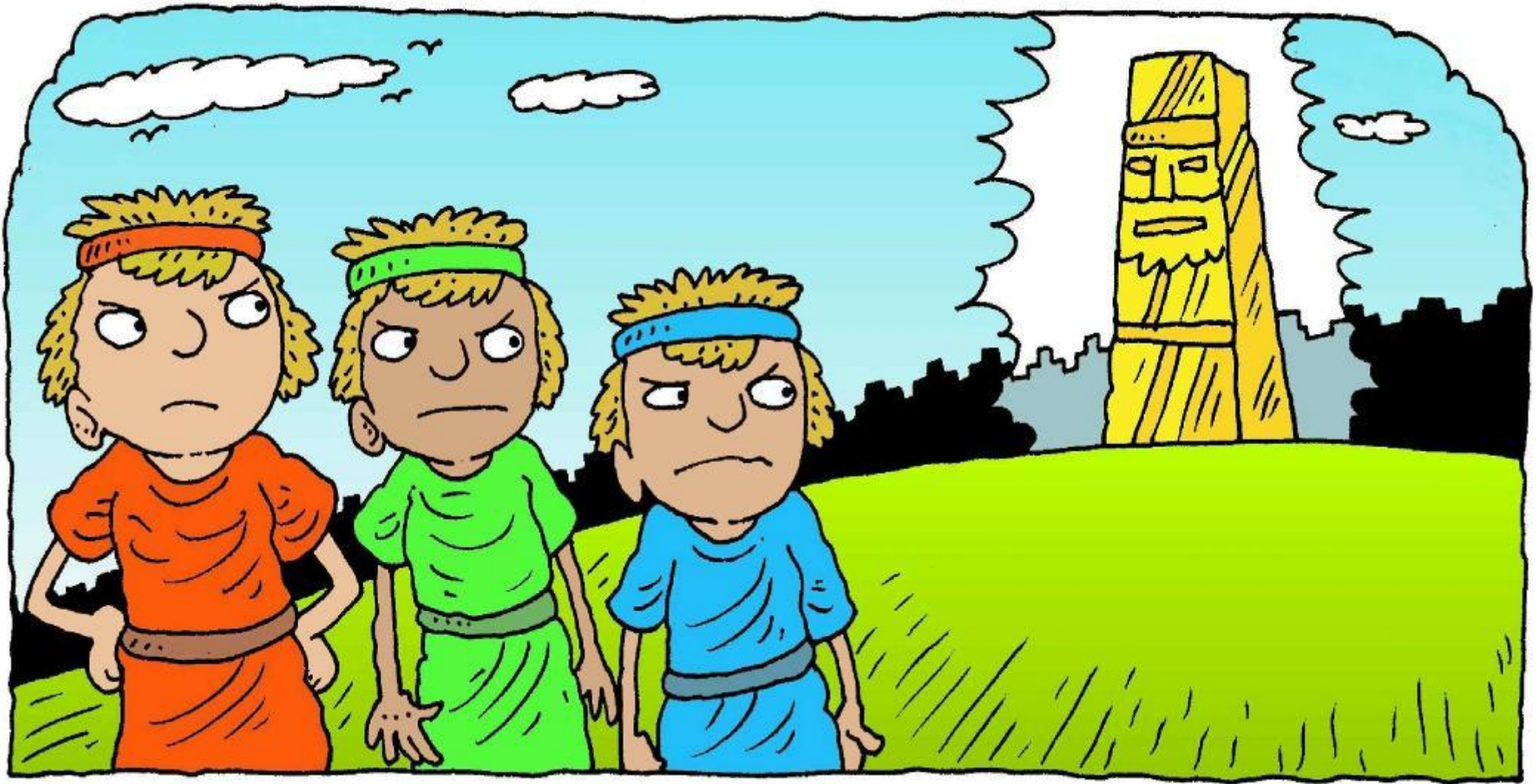

and trusting God and it was hard to do.

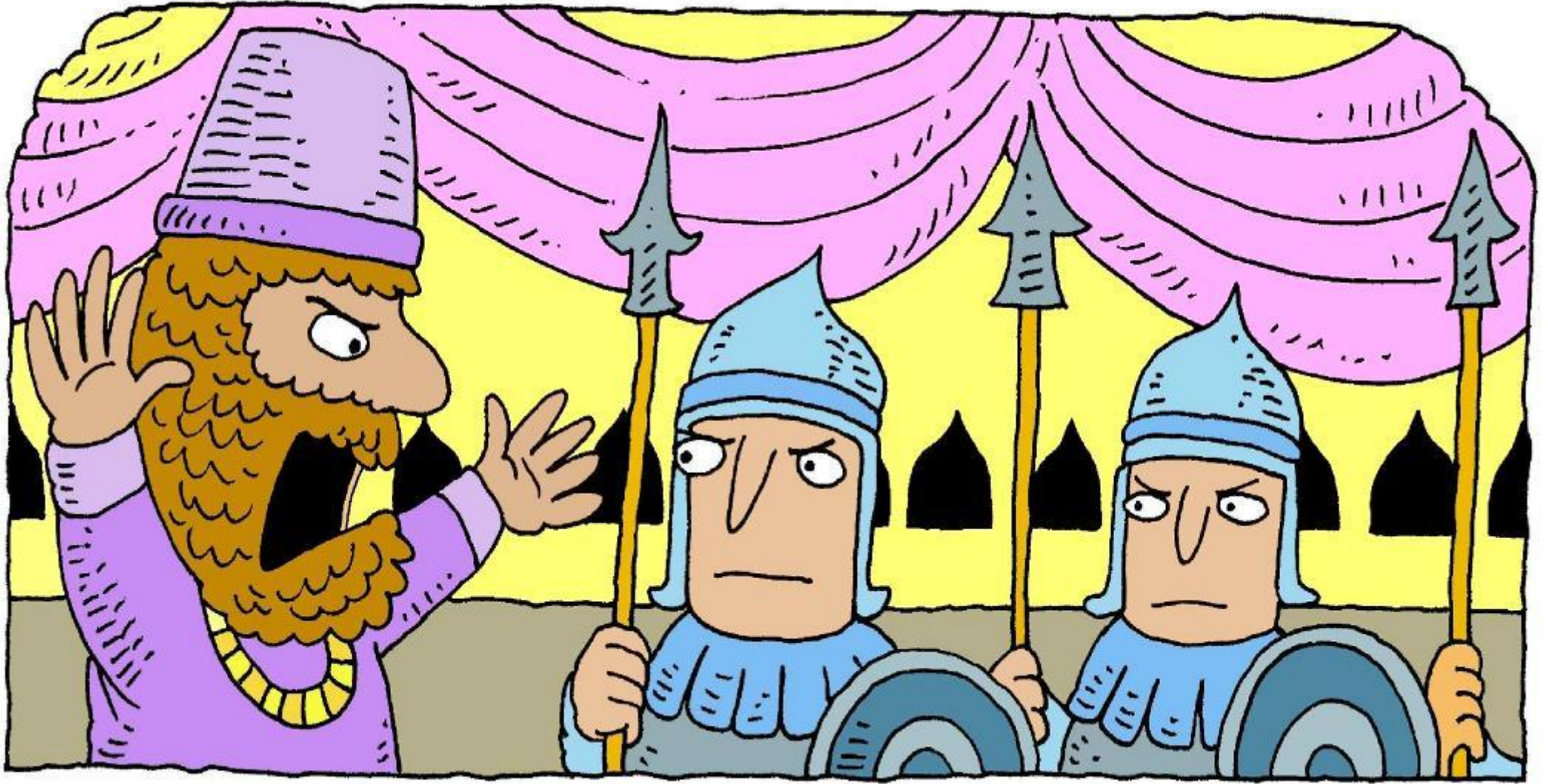


King Nebuchadnezzar made a new rule.

they said, “not to a statue a man has made.”



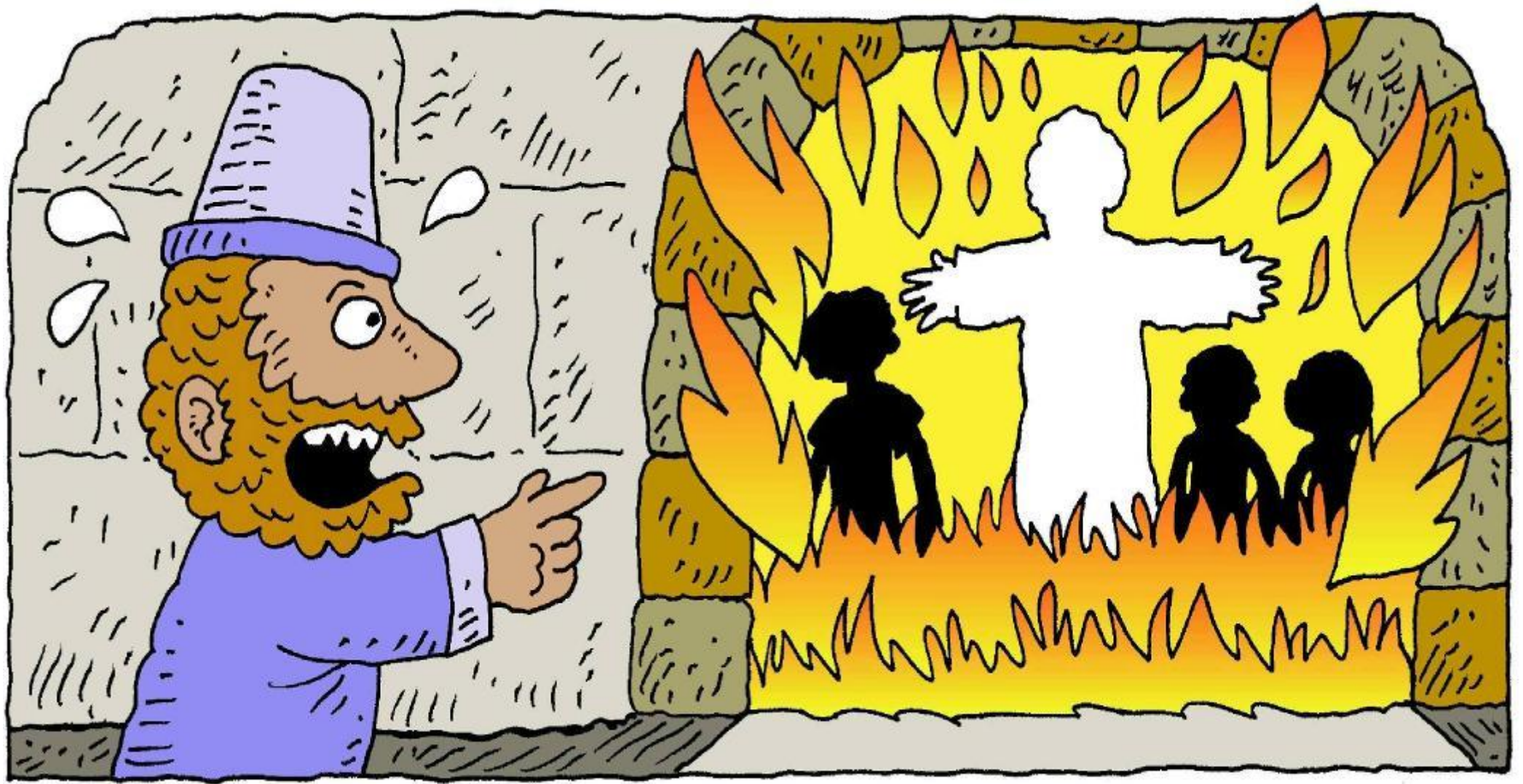
The king was **VERY** angry and made another rule. "These men will be thrown into a **VERY** hot fire," he said. "This will make them change their mind."
