

MARY AND THE ANGEL GABRIEL

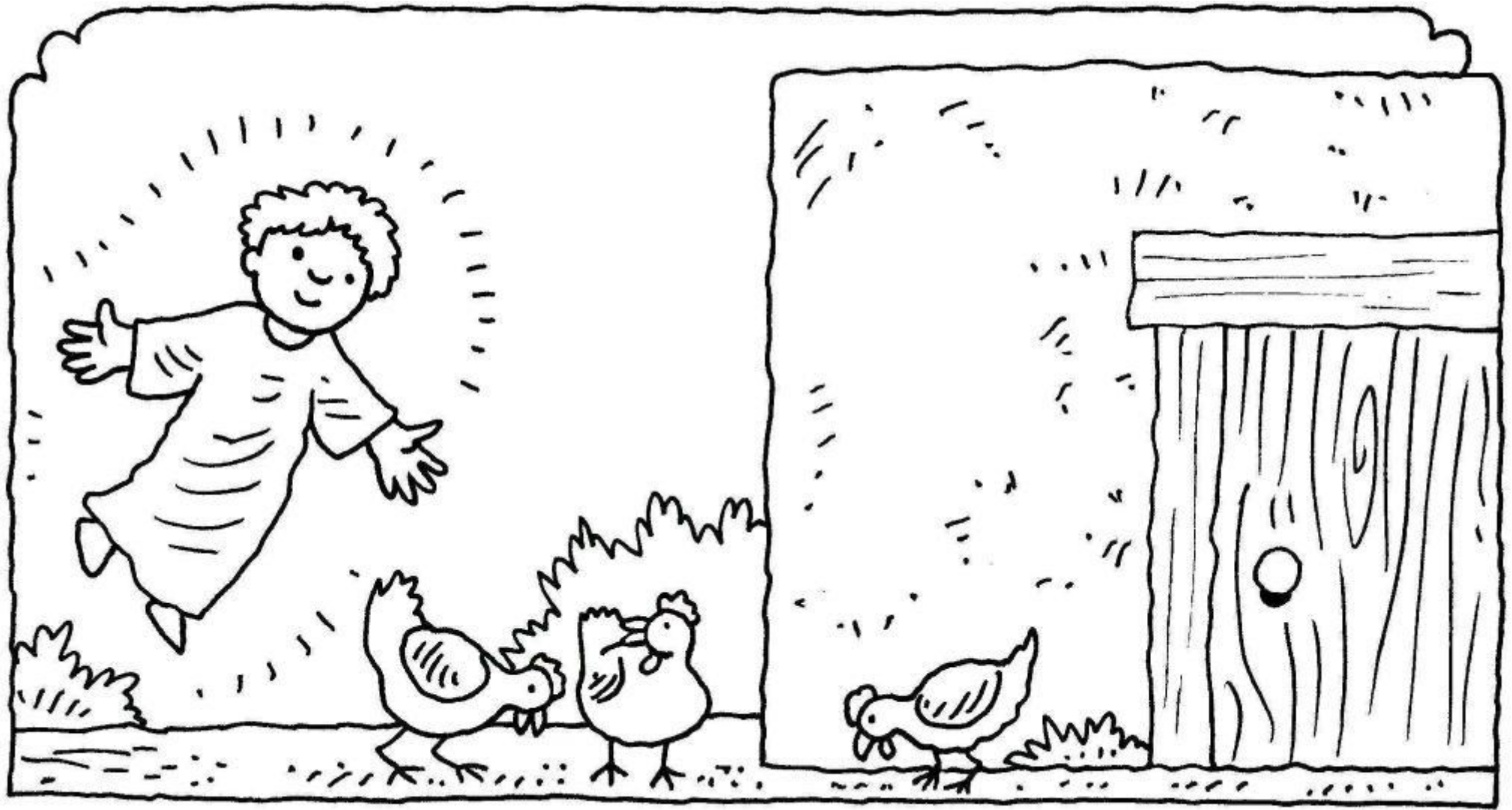

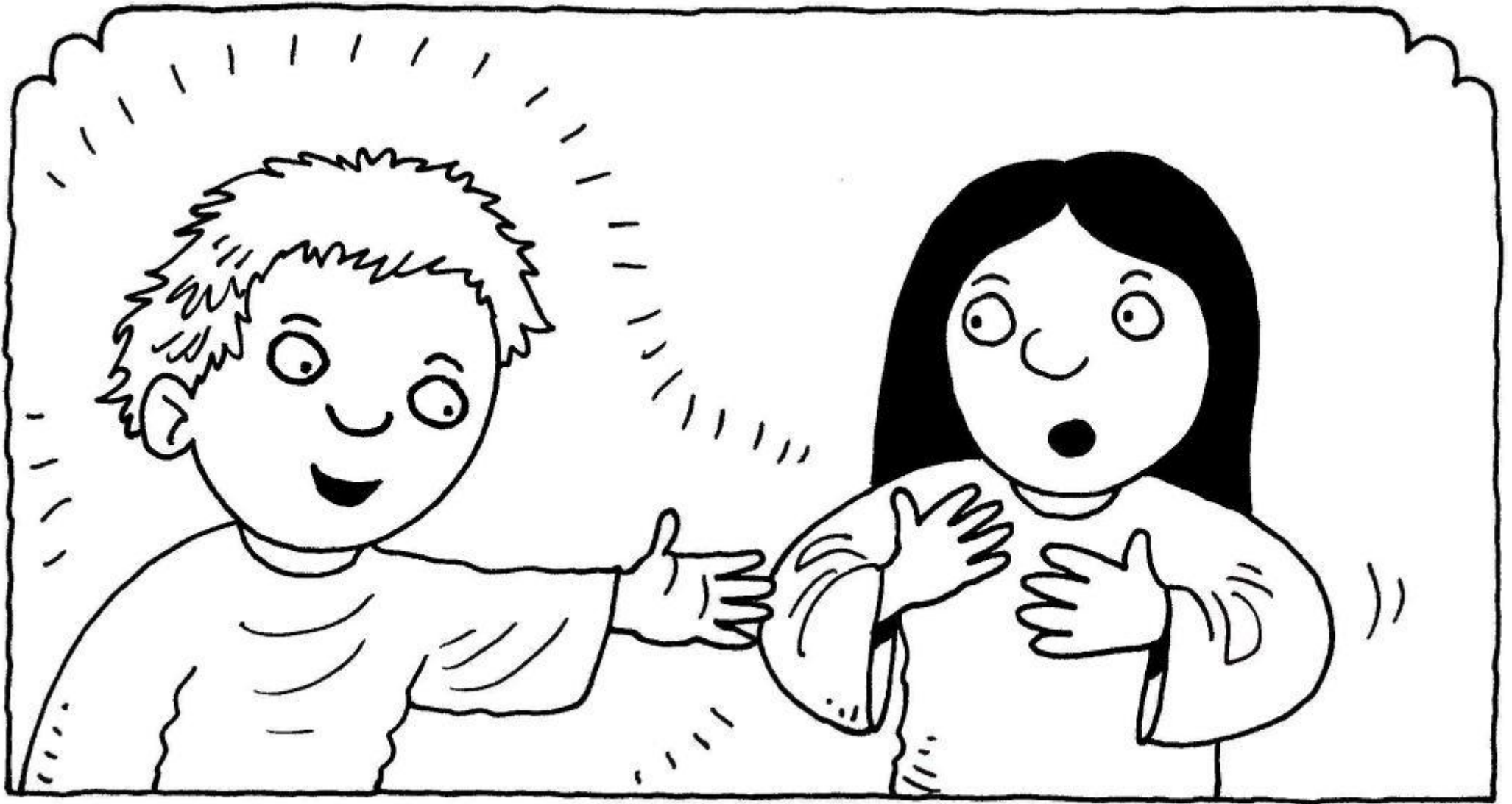




For a long, long time people had read God's promises that one day He would send His own Son from heaven to rule the earth and bring hope and peace, so people waited and prayed.



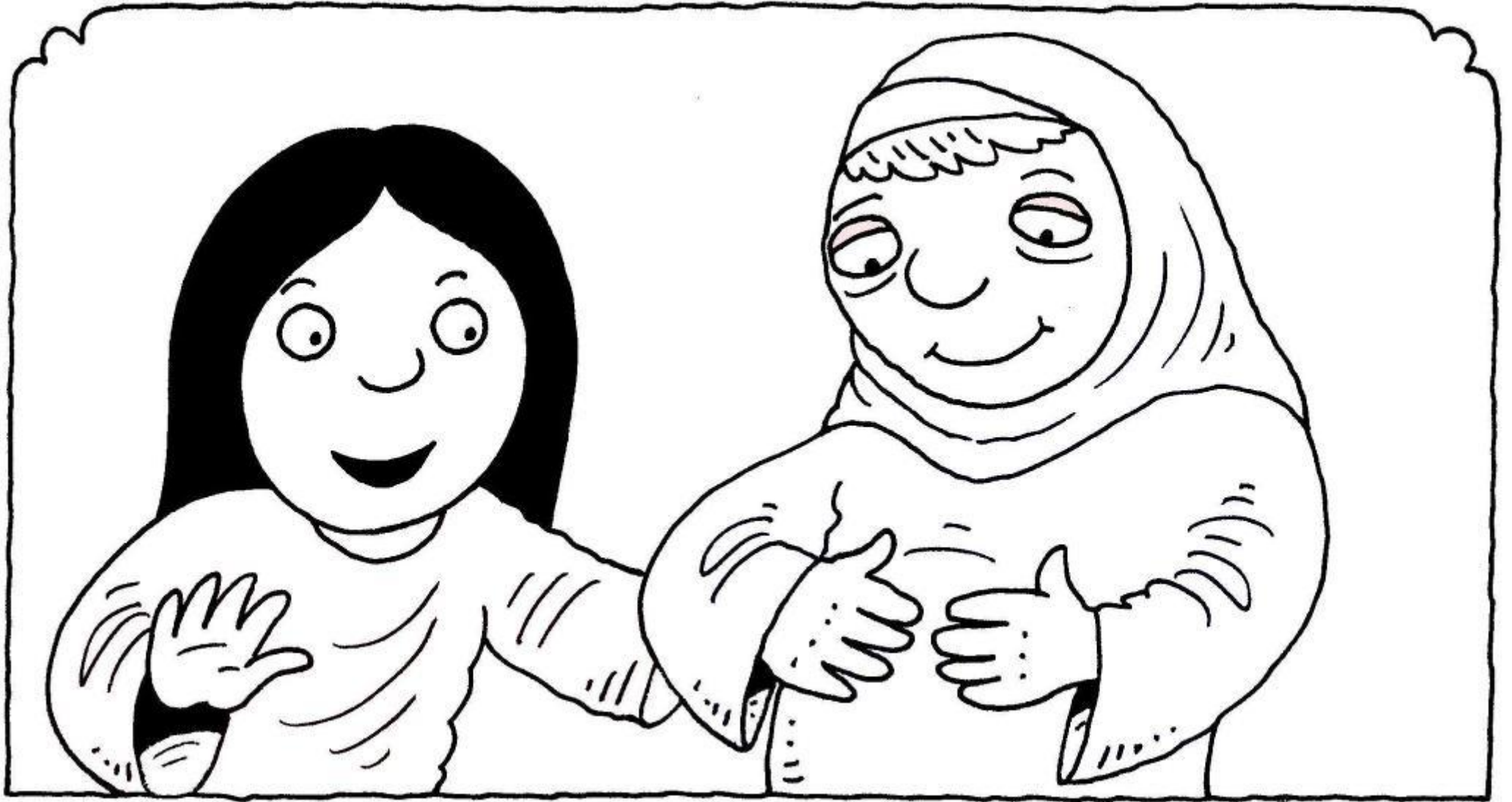

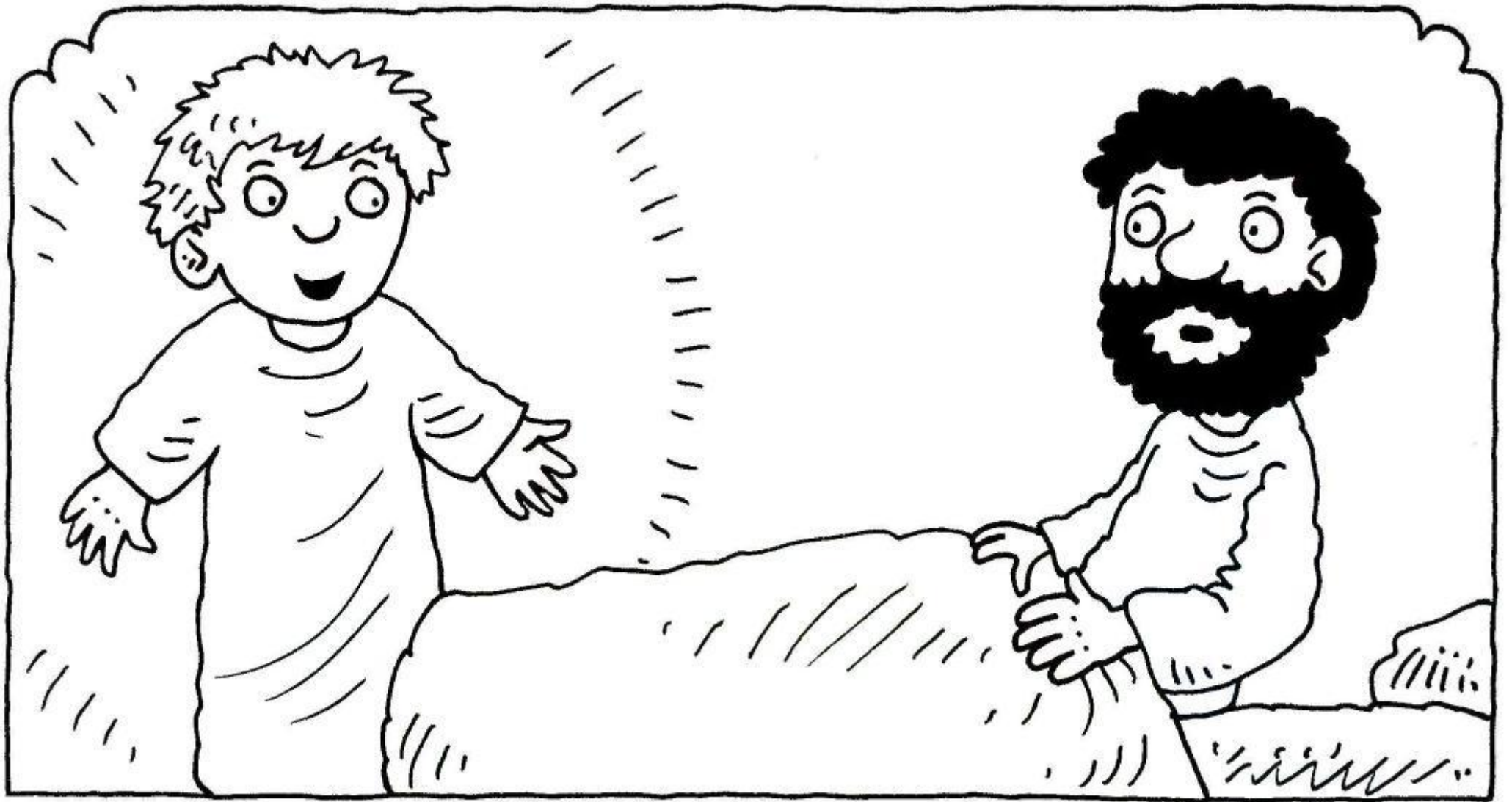
