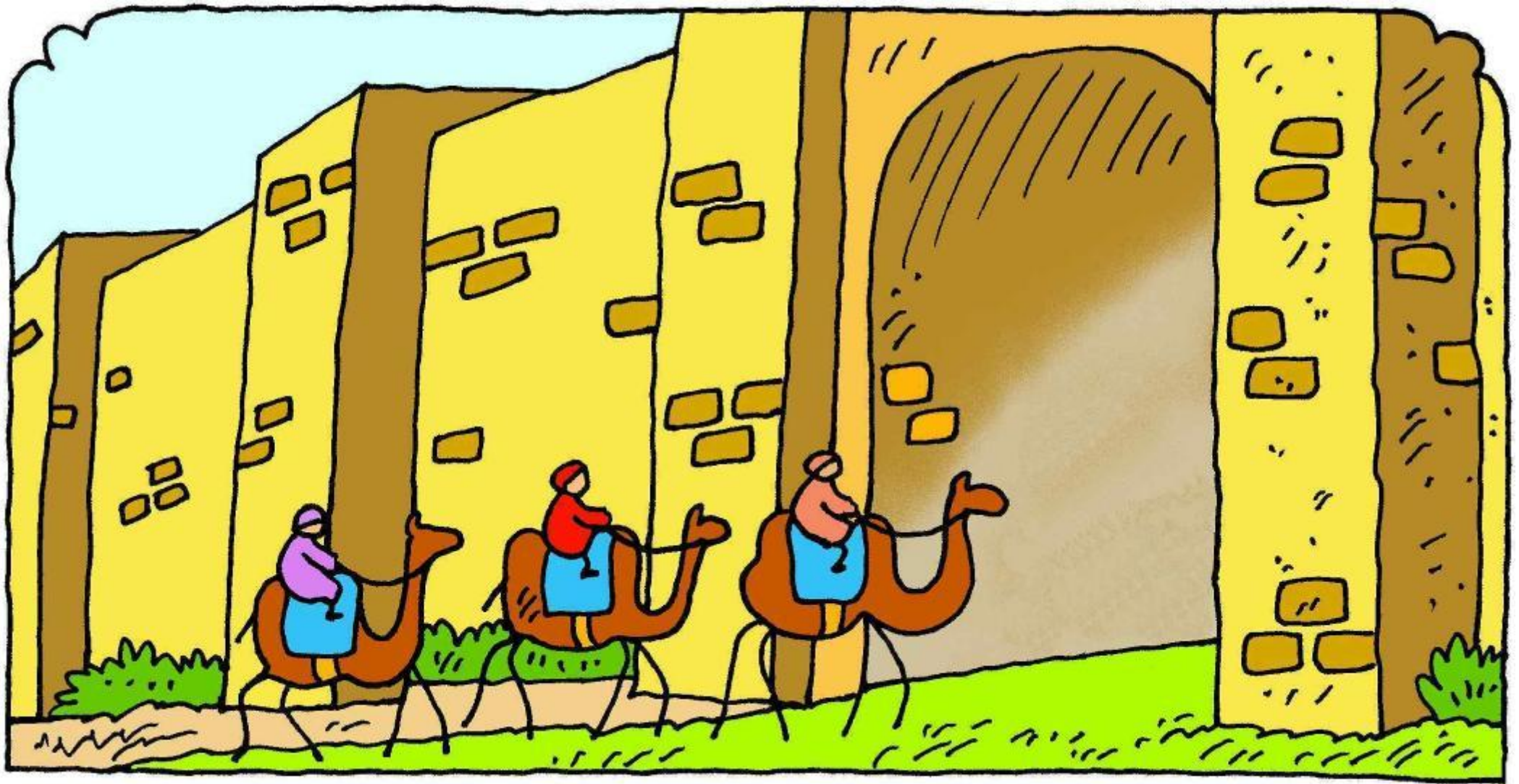


Herod Tries To Get Rid Of The Baby King

Herod asked the Wisemen when they had first seen the star and sent them to Bethlehem to find the young child.

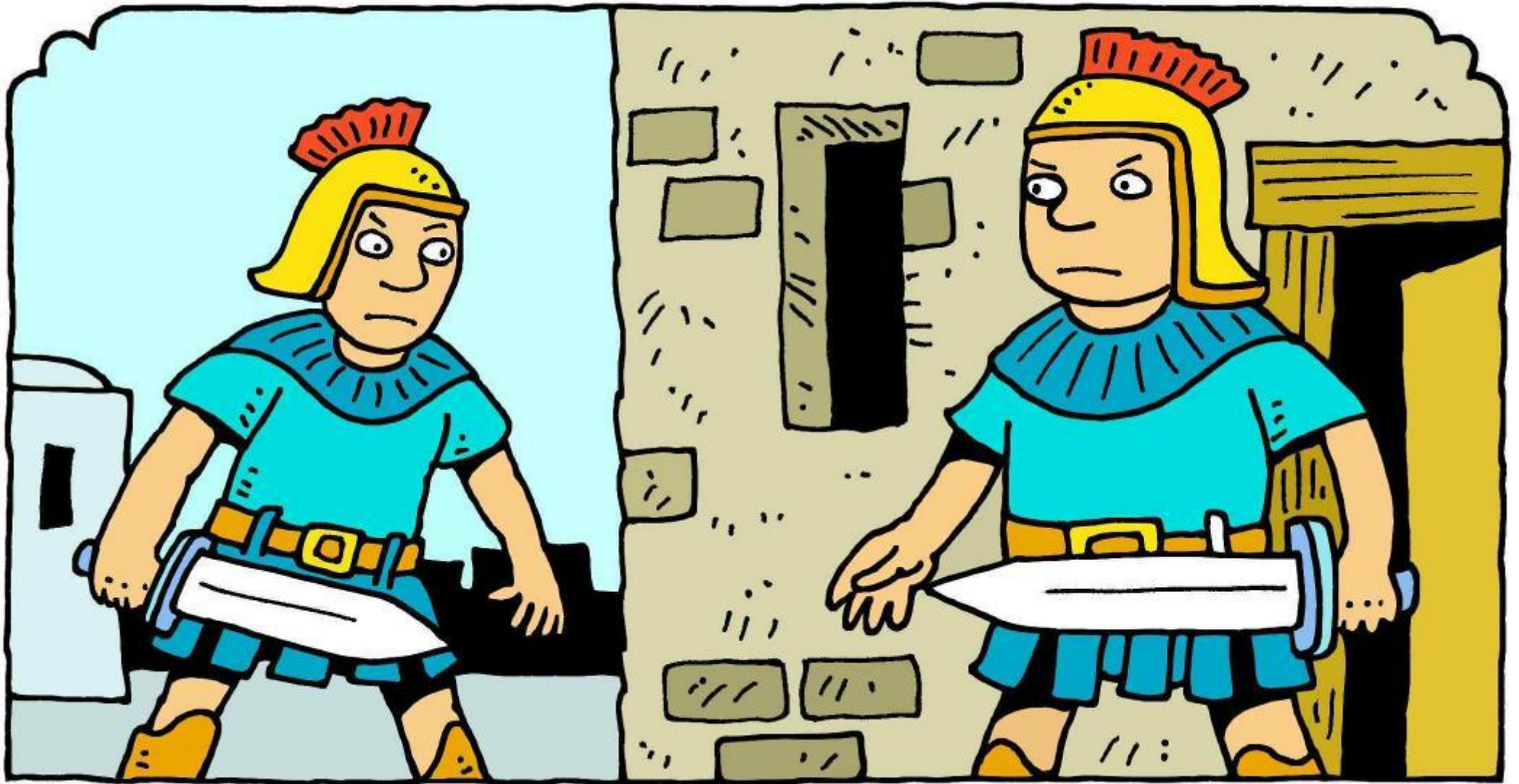
“When you find him,” said King Herod slyly, “come and tell me, so I can go and worship him too.”
