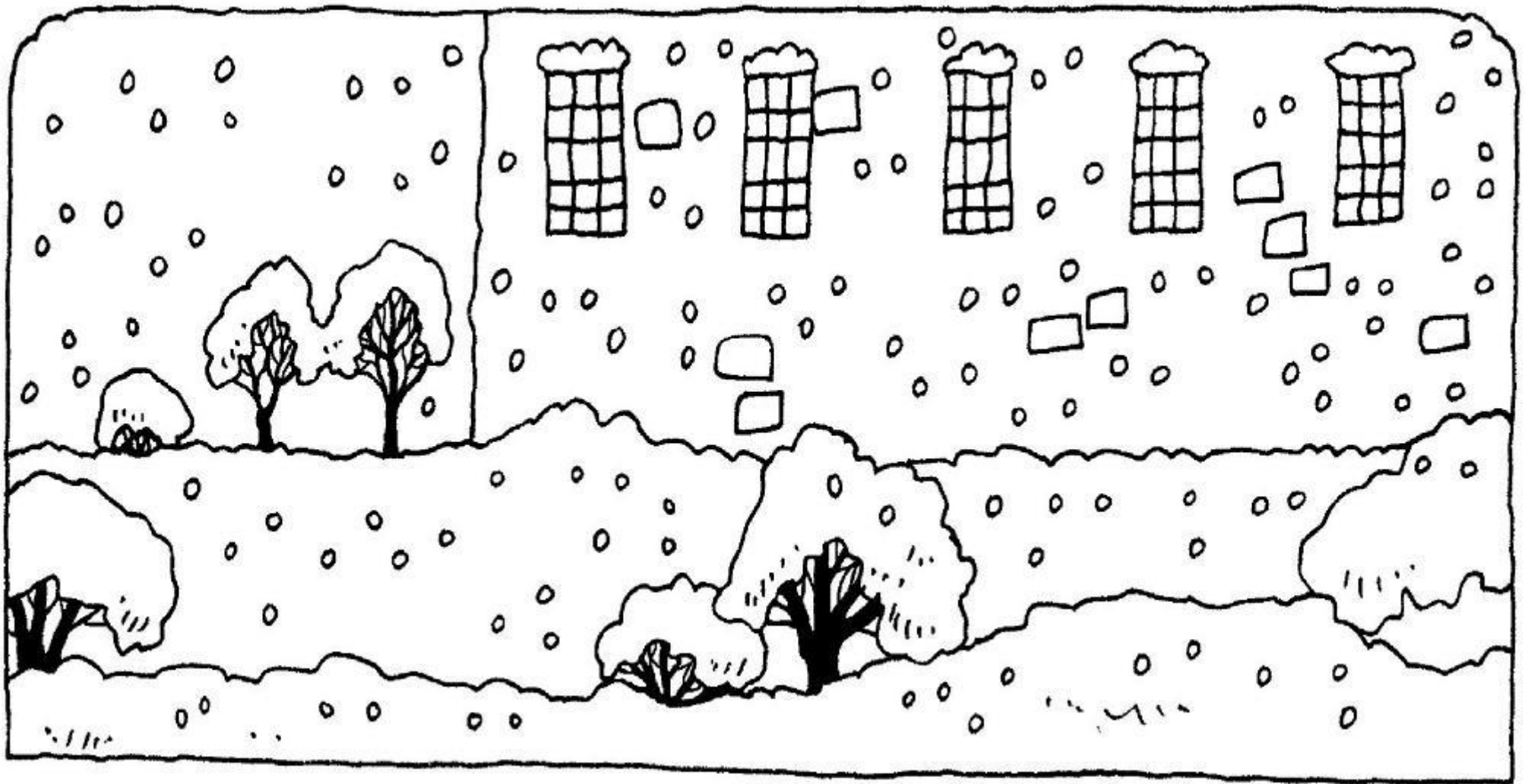

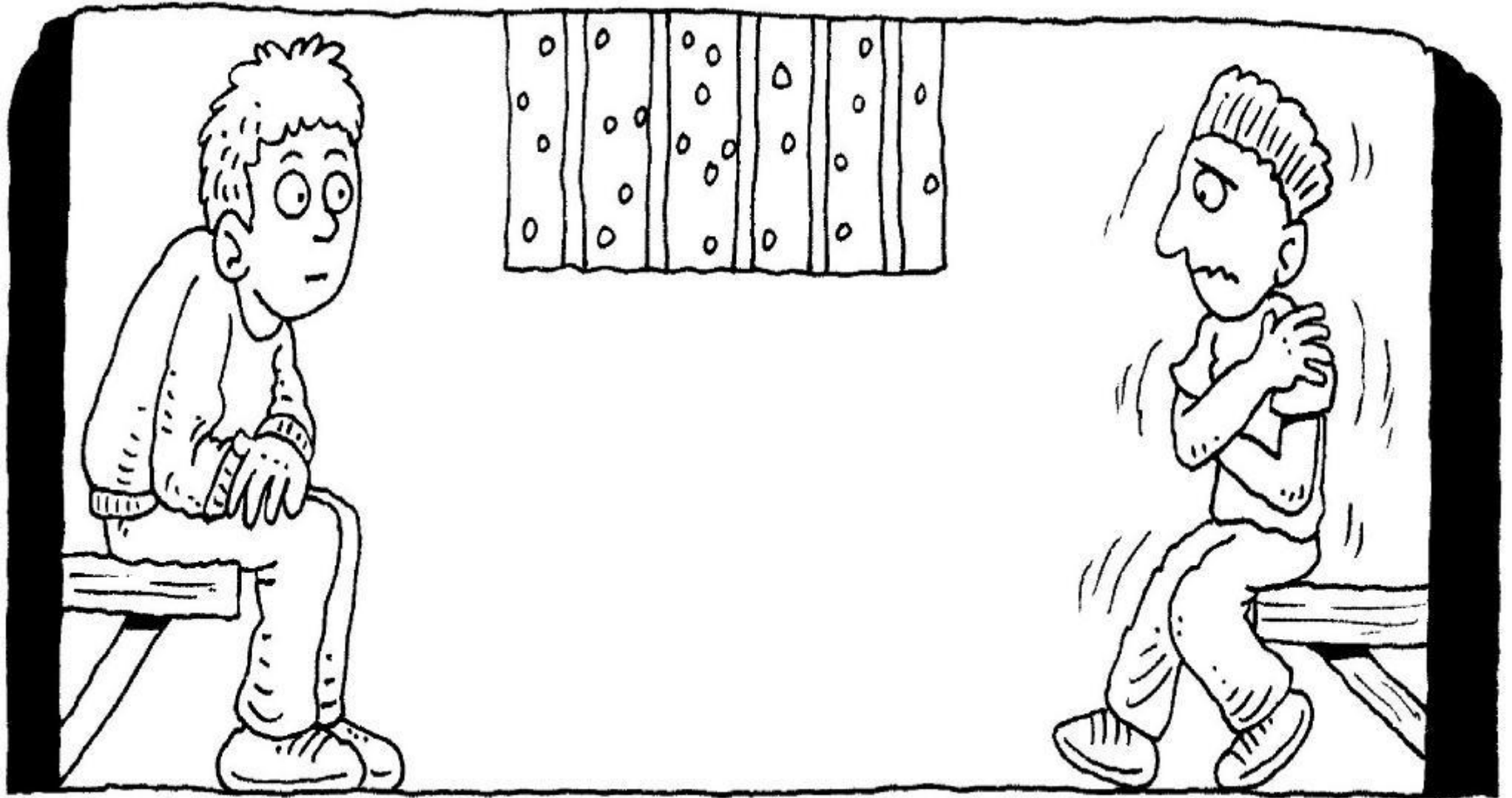




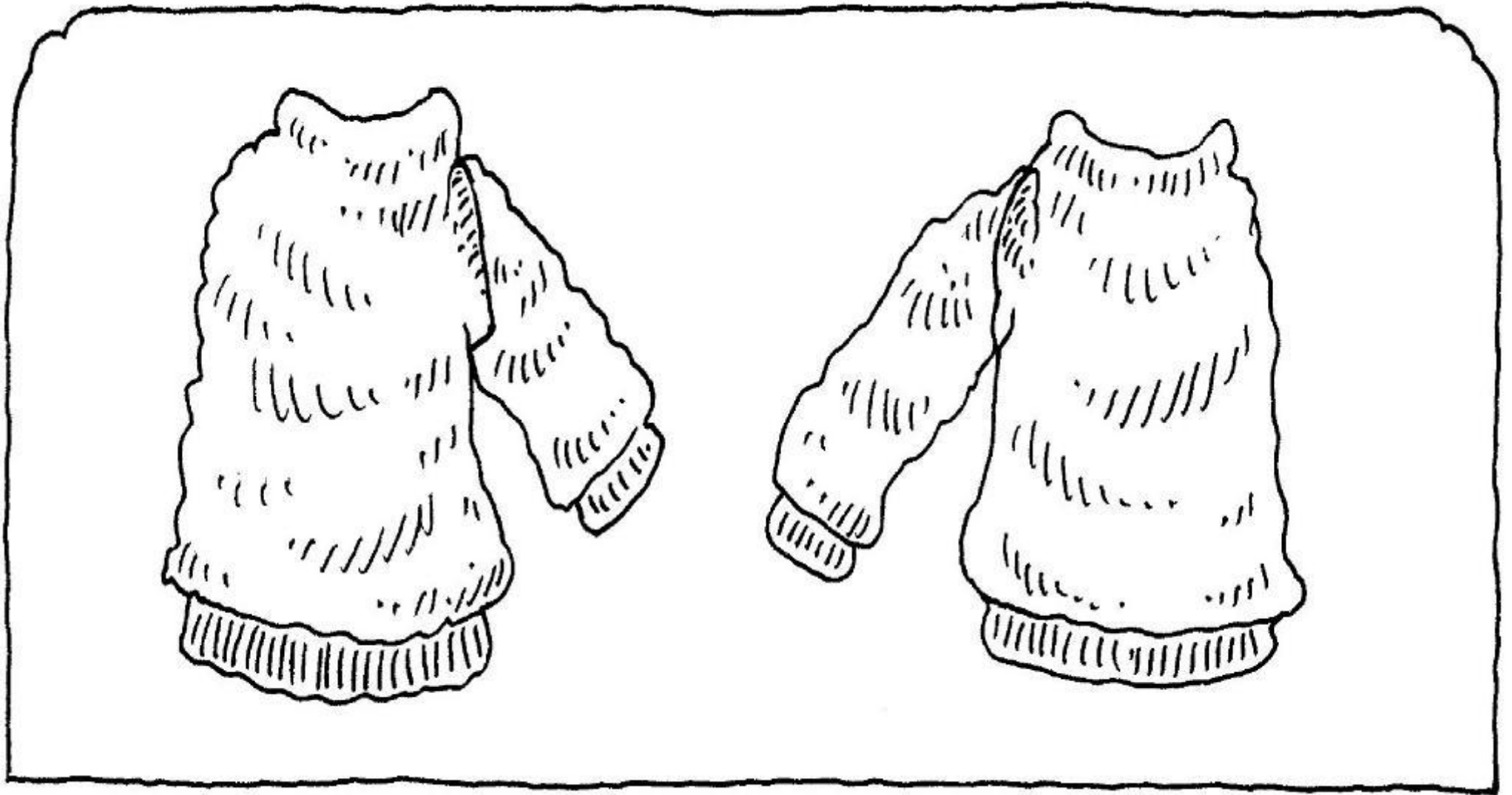
A long time ago, in a far away country,

how much God loved them.



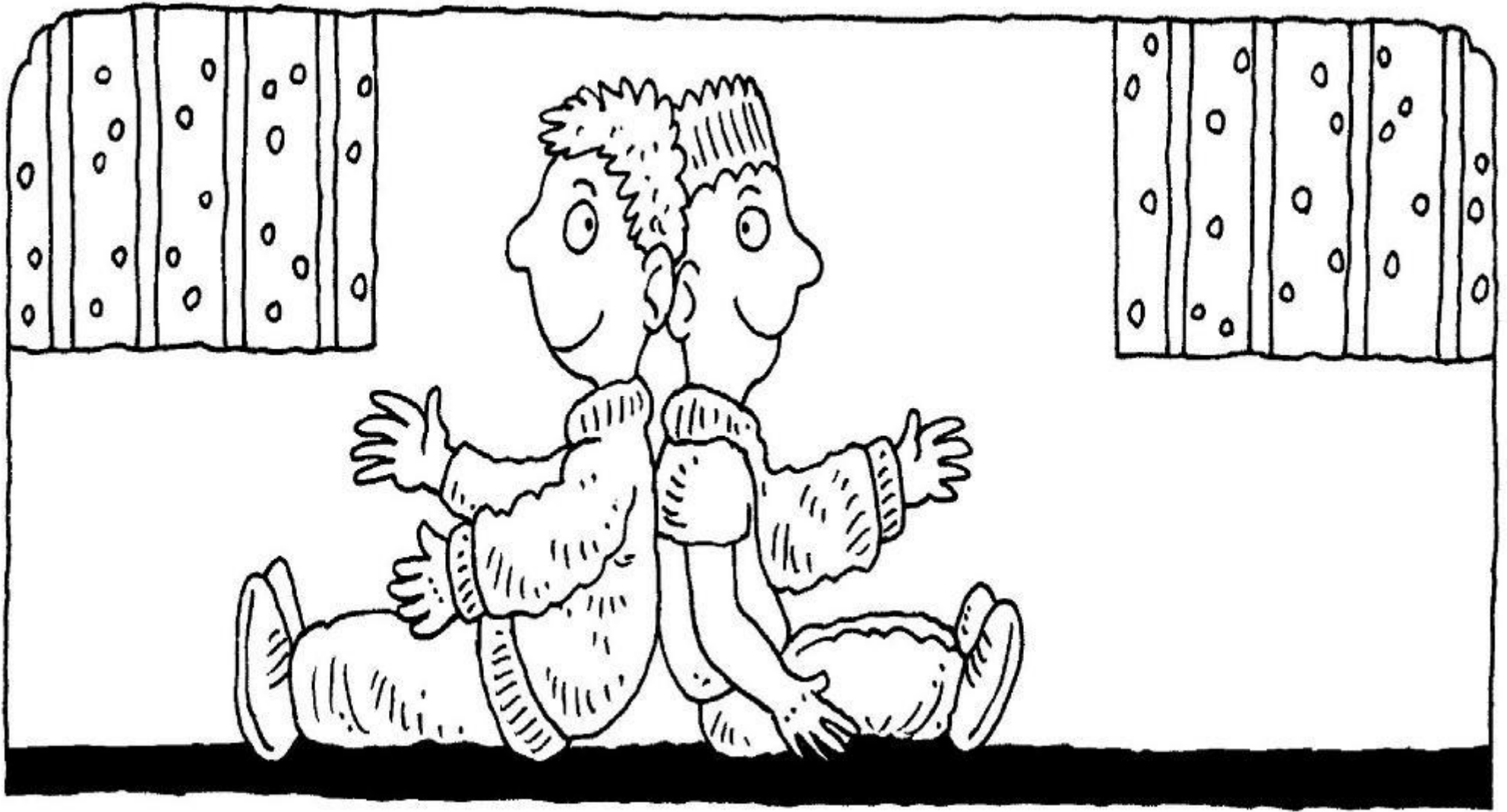
But the government made a new rule.

good Pastor was sent to prison.



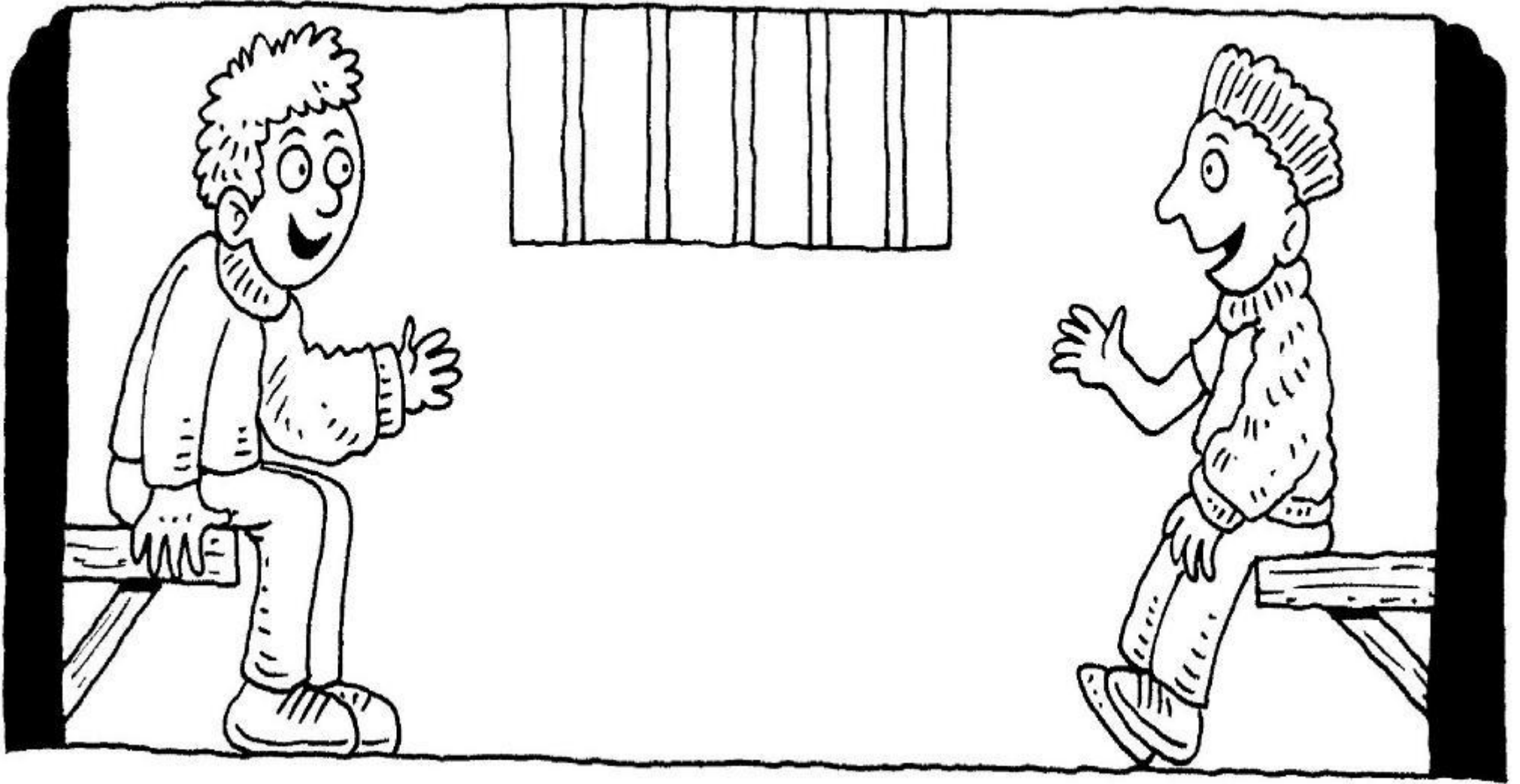
He thanked God that he was wearing his jumper. The other prisoner in his cell was cold and hungry. "We will freeze or starve to death here," he said.



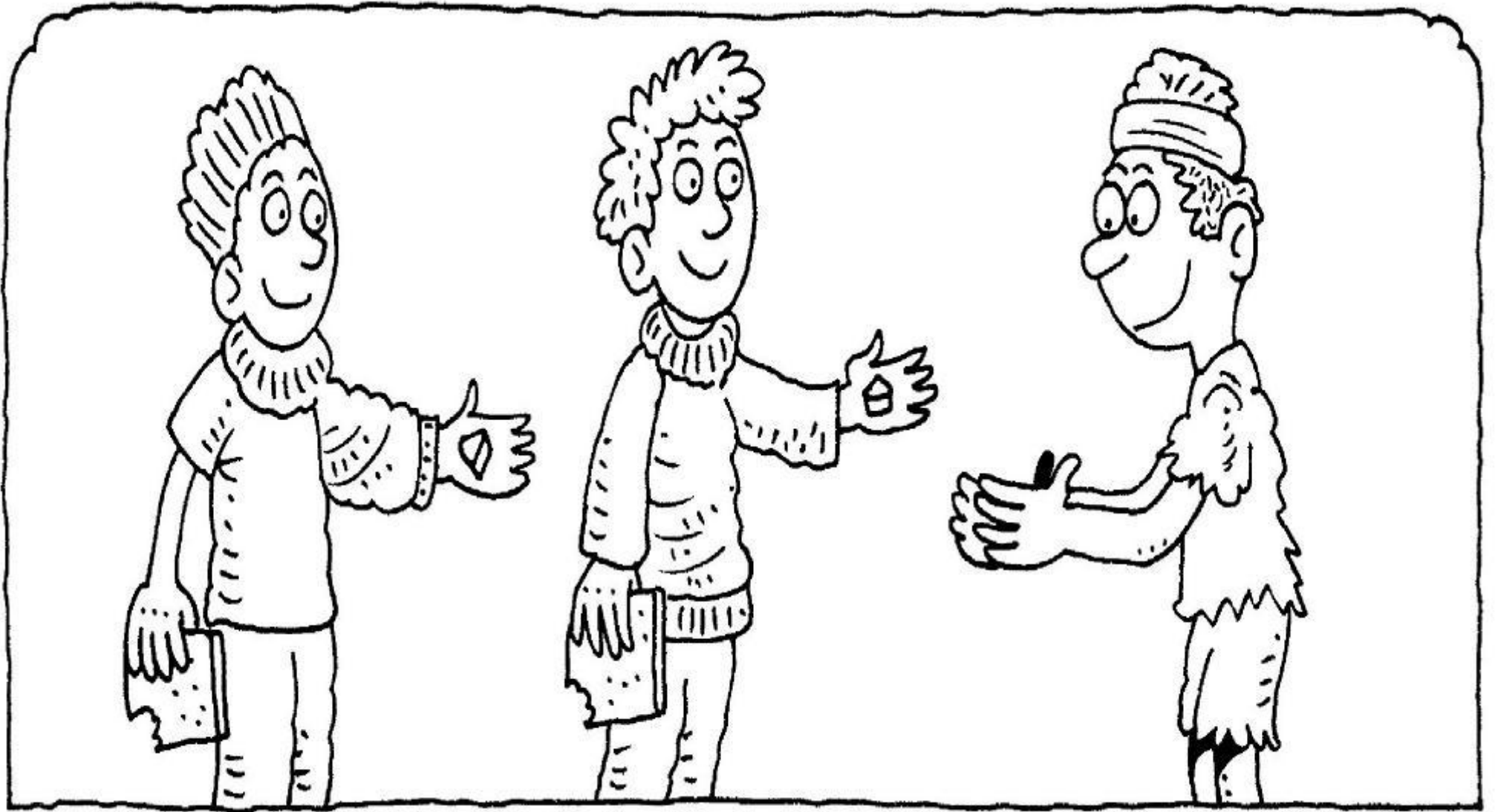
“How can God be with you
