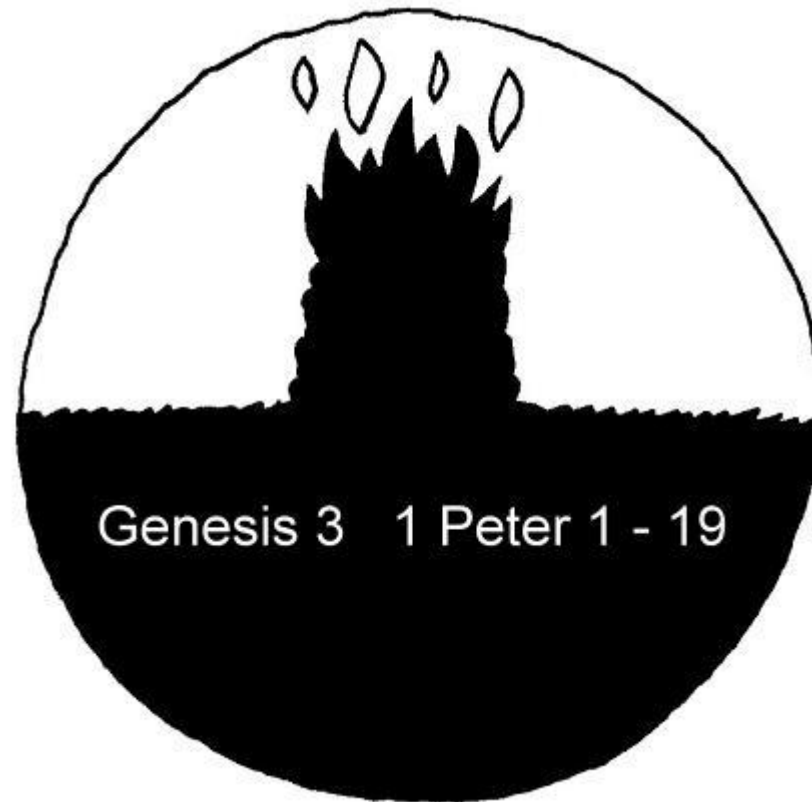


The Atonement Lamb

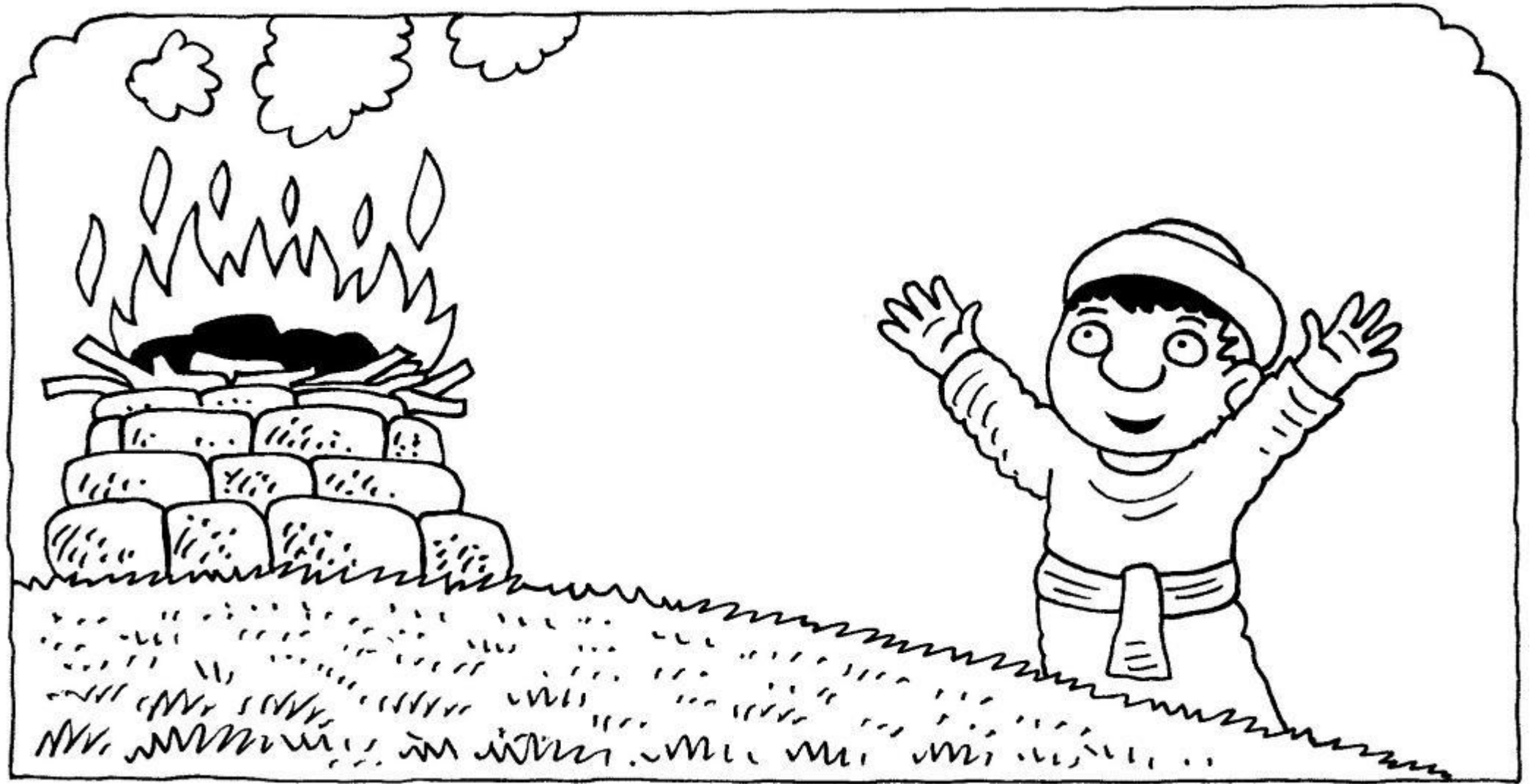

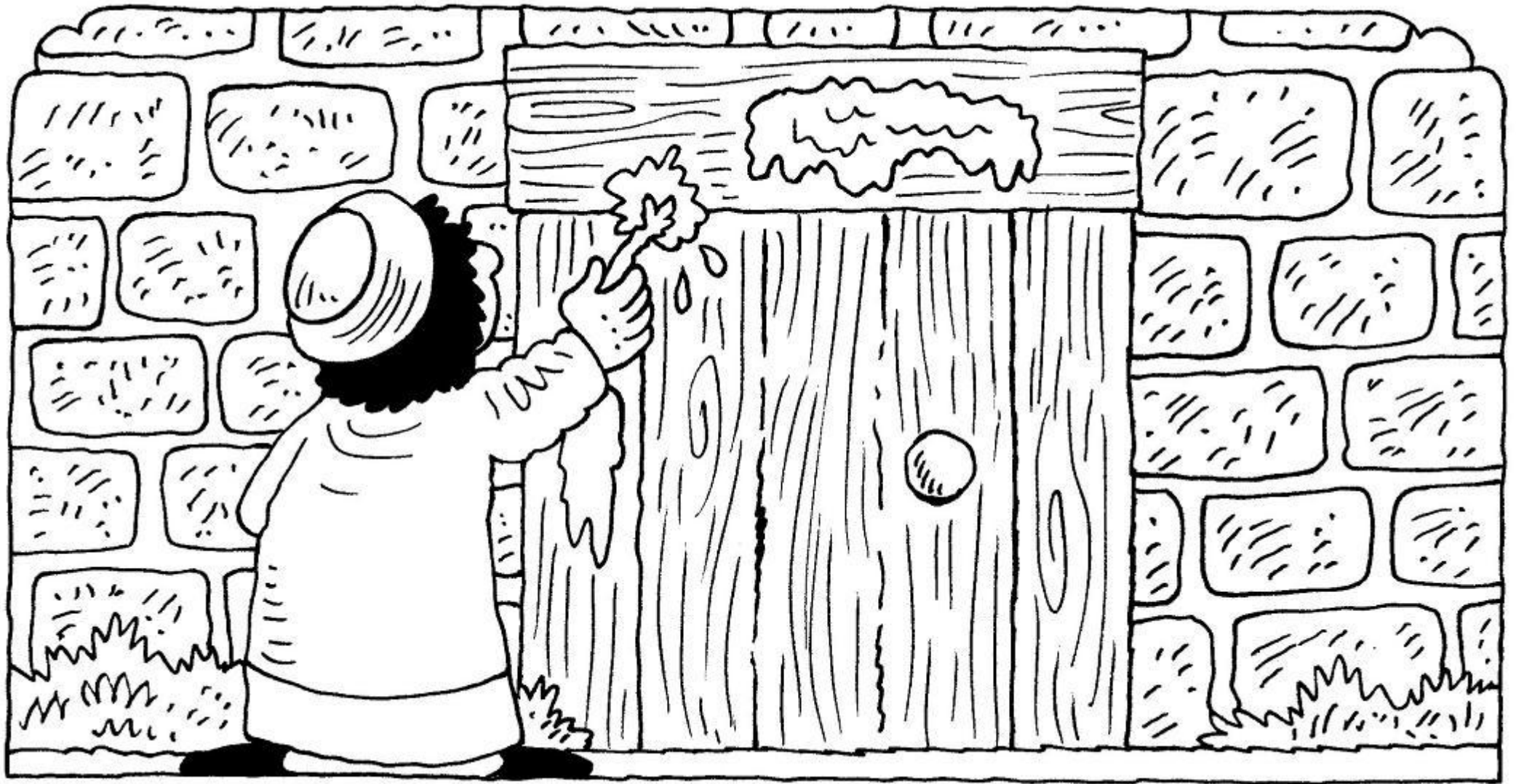
When Adam and Eve disobeyed God they were sent out of the garden of Eden and were no longer near Him, because sin separates us from a Holy God. Genesis 3.

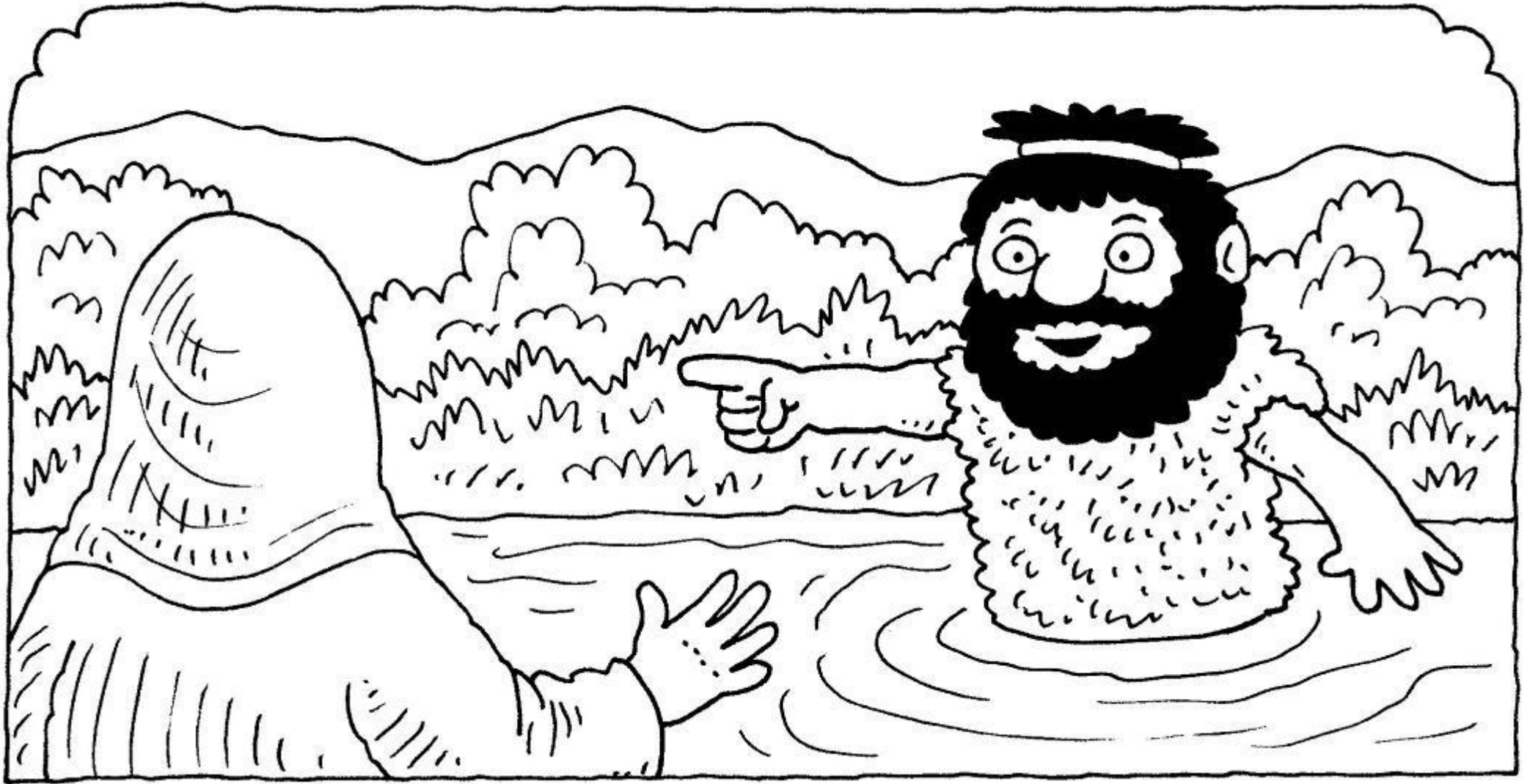

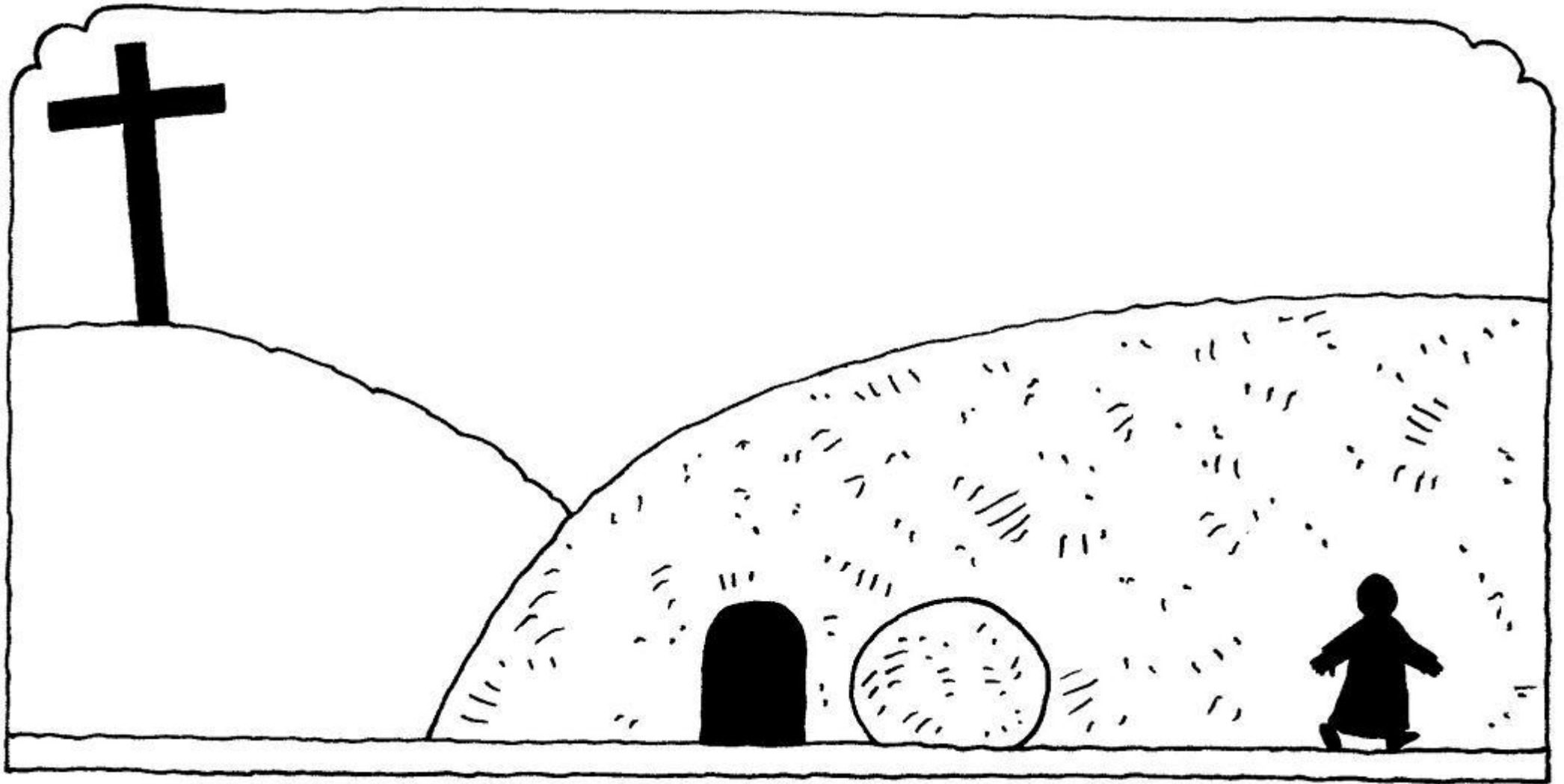
On Passover night, the blood of a lamb was painted above the door. The children of Israel were safe when the Angel of God passed over the house. Exodus 12.
