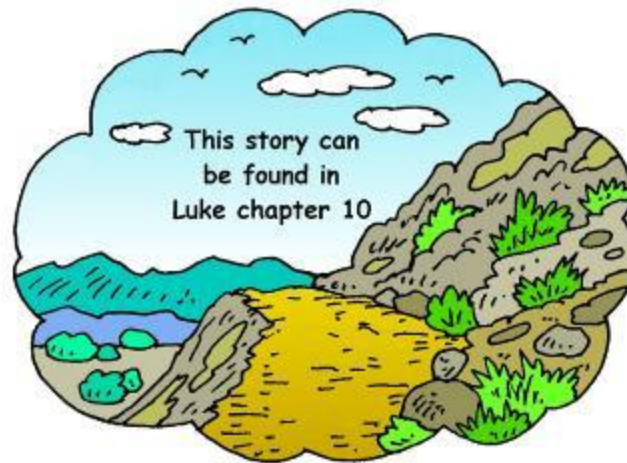


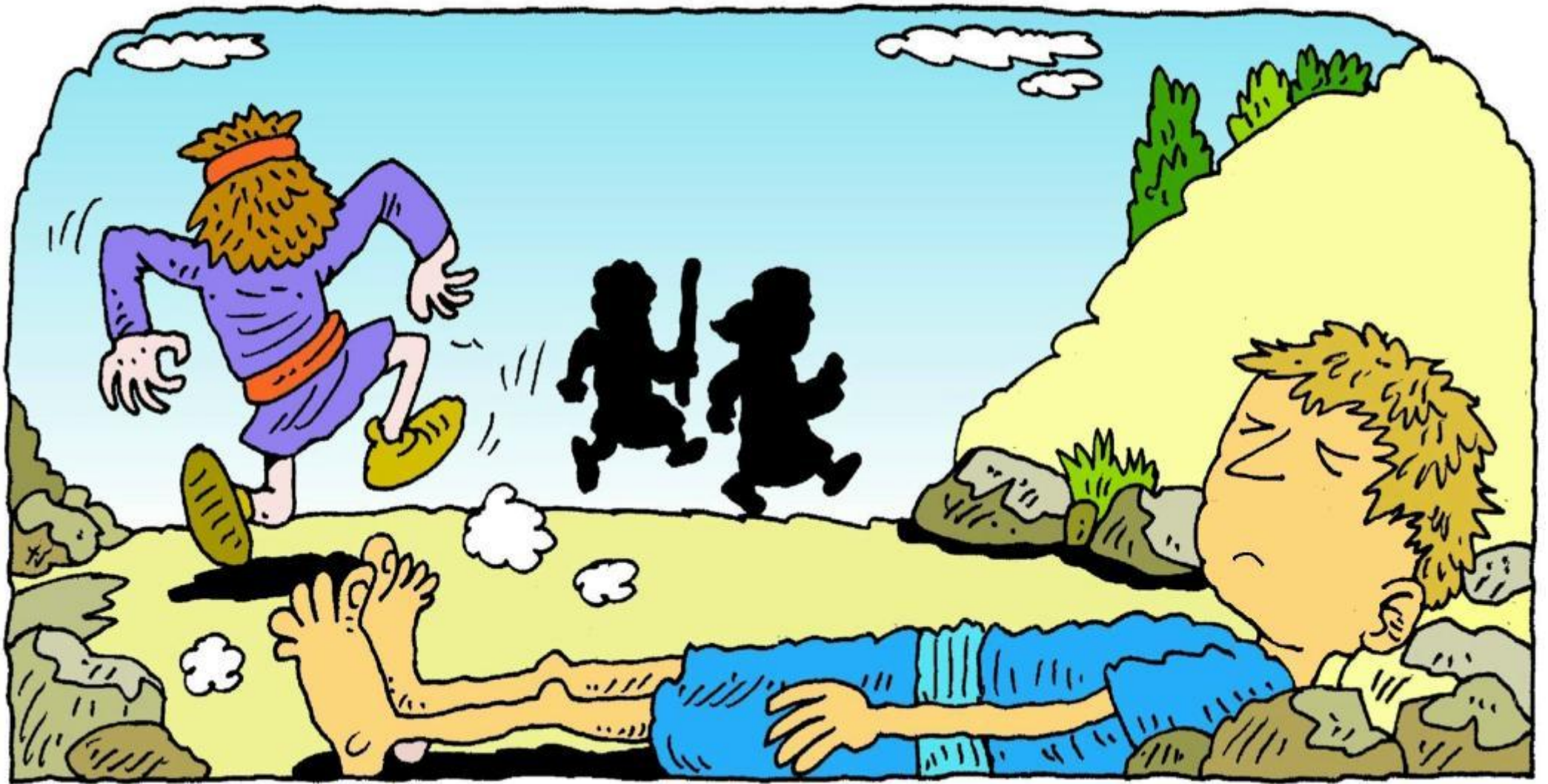
The Kind Man From Samaria

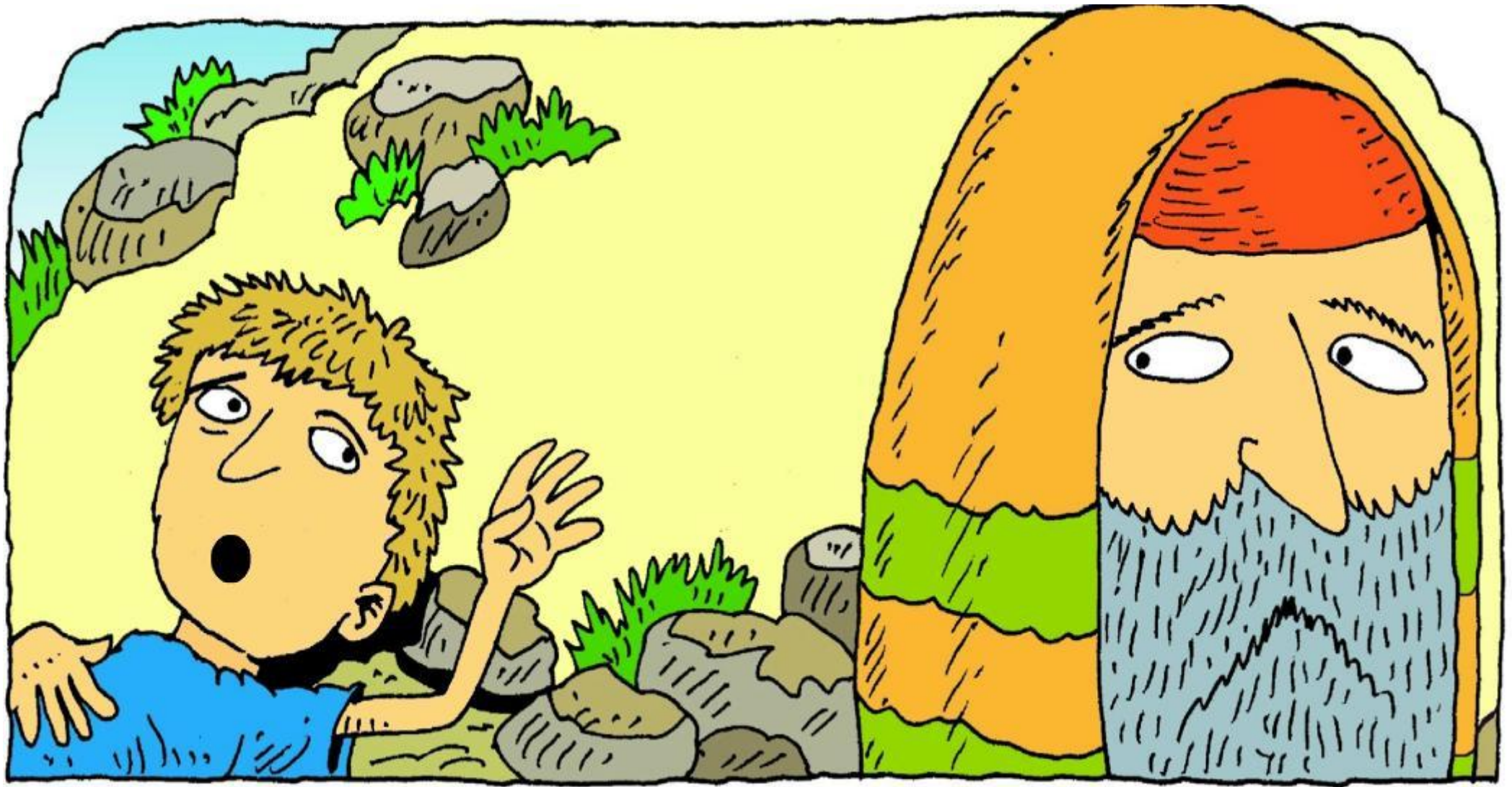




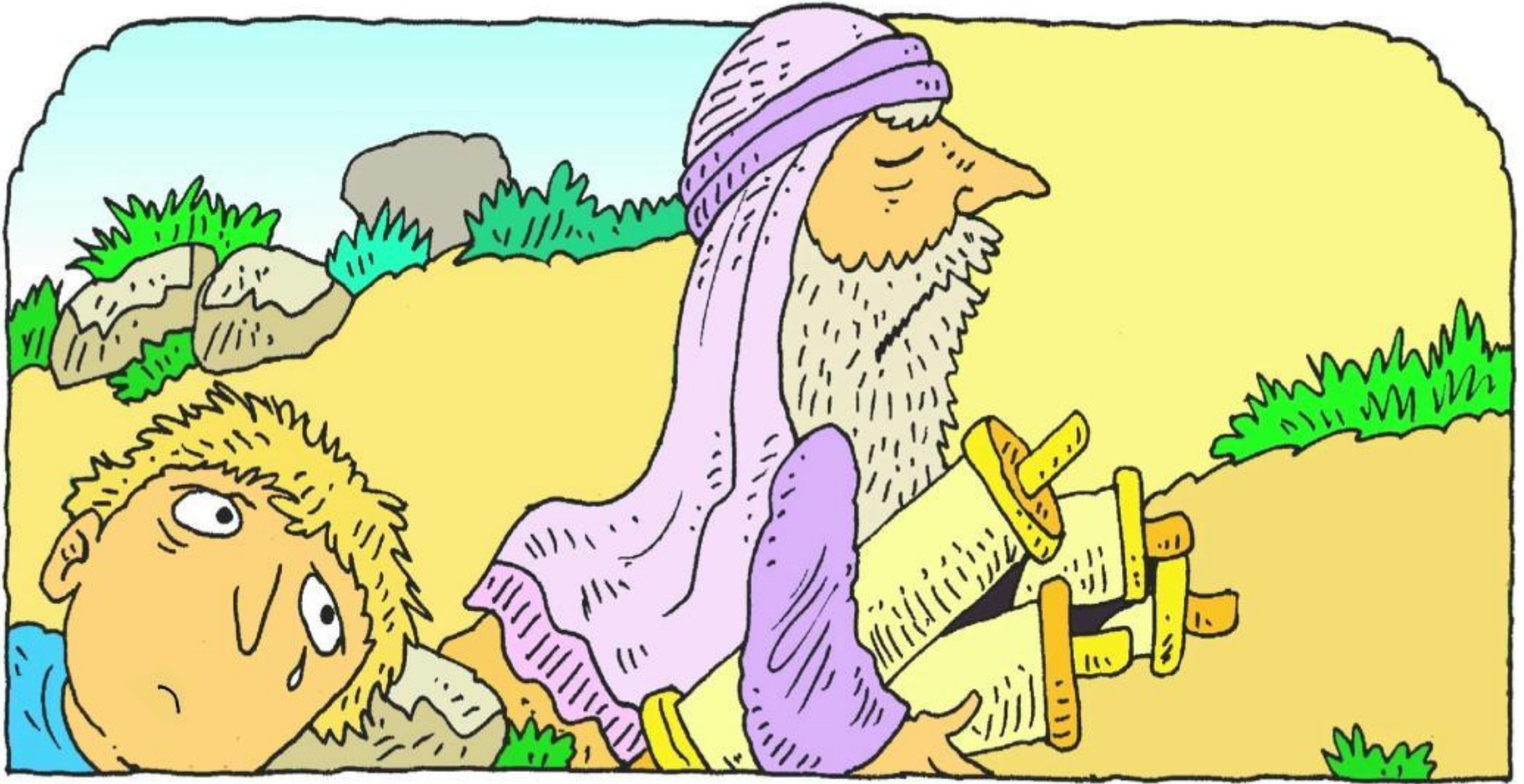
A man was walking along the road

and left him lying on the side of the road, badly hurt.



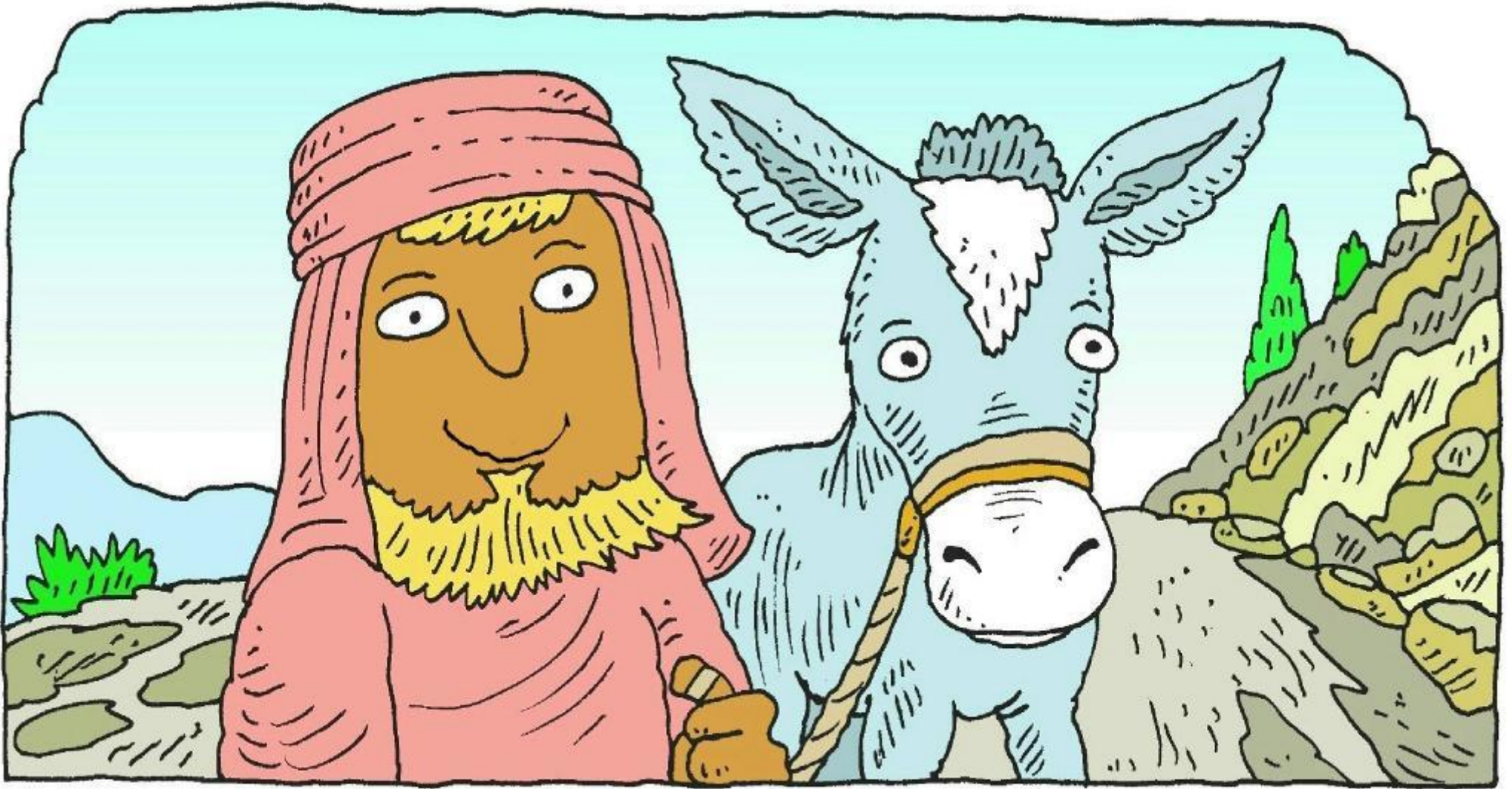
The hurt man lay in the hot sun.
