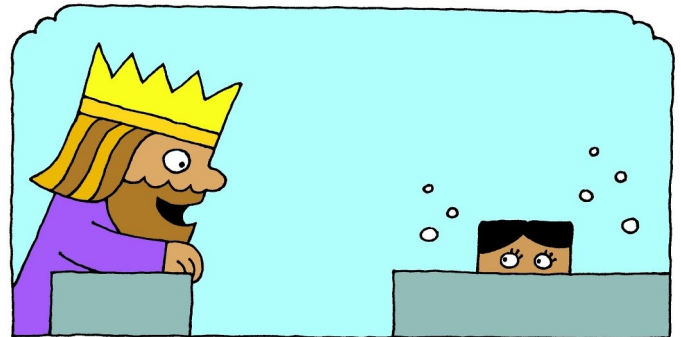
One of God's Ten Commandments says not to steal another man's wife. David tried to hide what he had done, but God sees and knows everything.



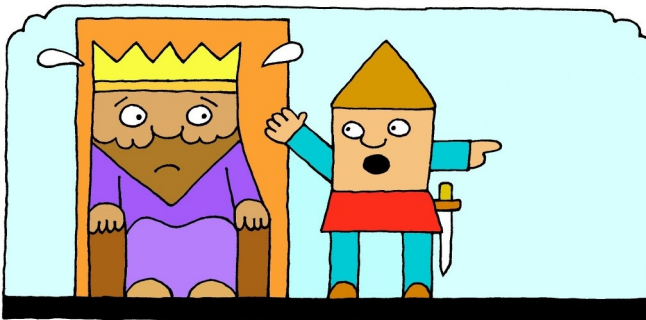
Every year, when the weather got warm again after winter, King David sent his soldiers off to fight their enemies.



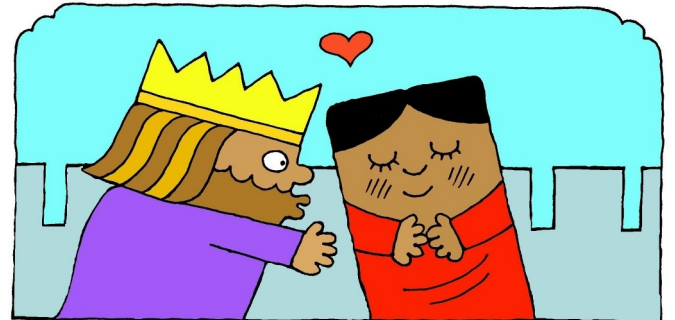
But, this time, he stayed at home. King David lazed about all day and in the evening got up off his bed and took a walk on his roof terrace.



As he looked over the city he saw a very beautiful young girl washing herself, on another terrace, nearby.



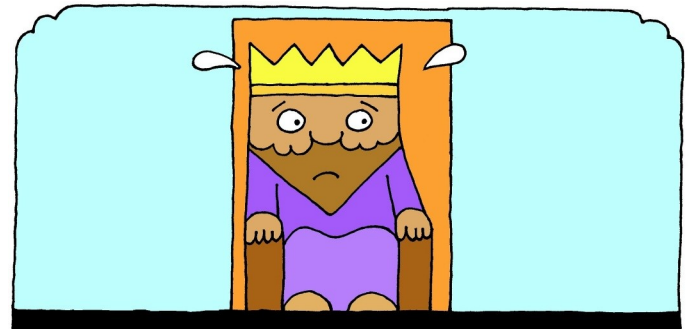
