
MOSES came to the Red sea



The bush didn't burn up, so he went closer to look and God talked to him out of the bush.




"Take off your shoes. This is Holy Ground. Go and tell Pharaoh to let my people go," said God. "I will help you." Moses did what God told him to do.




"God has sent me to tell you to let God's people go," he told Pharaoh. "No! They are my best workers," Pharaoh said. "I will not let them go."
